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1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the Severe Mental Illness Task

- 2 Force.
- WHEREAS, approximately 2.6 percent of adults in Kentucky live with a severe
- 4 mental illness such as schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, major depressive disorder,
- 5 or bipolar disorder; and
- 6 WHEREAS, severe mental illnesses often produce distortions of perception,
- 7 delusions, hallucinations, and unusual behaviors that can reflect a loss of contact with
- 8 perceived reality; and
- 9 WHEREAS, fewer than 47 percent of adults in Kentucky with a diagnosed mental
- illness receive any form of treatment; and
- WHEREAS, severe mental illness can have a significant impact on individuals,
- their families, and their communities; and
- WHEREAS, Kentucky ranks 45th in per capita spending on mental health services;
- 14 and
- WHEREAS, Kentucky is ranked 29th in the nation for mental health workforce
- 16 availability; and
- WHEREAS, Kentucky is ranked 19th in the nation for providing access to mental
- health services; and
- WHEREAS, severe mental illnesses are treatable, and people with these disorders
- 20 can experience recovery with proper treatment and management;
- NOW, THEREFORE,
- 22 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 23 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
- 24 → Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the Severe
- 25 Mental Illness Task Force to study the provision of mental health services to adults
- 26 diagnosed with a severe mental illness in Kentucky.
- → Section 2. The duties of the task force shall include but are not limited to:

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1 (1) Assessing the availability of adequate treatment options, medication, case 2 management, and affordable housing for individuals with a severe mental illness;

- 3 (2) Evaluating the efficacy of psychiatric medications and identifying strategies to 4 maximize the use of best practices in medication therapy, management, and adherence;
- 5 (3) Examining the relationship between being diagnosed with a severe mental illness and experiencing homelessness and making recommendations to reduce the occurrence rate of homelessness among individuals with a severe mental illness in Kentucky;

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- (4) Evaluating the effectiveness of mental health courts, crisis intervention teams, and forensic assertive community treatment in Kentucky in diverting individuals with a severe mental illness away from the criminal justice system, and making recommendations for expanding these programs; and
- (5) Exploring the efficacy and utilization of Tim's Law, KRS 202A.0811 to 202A.0831, assistive outpatient treatment, and assertive community treatment in ensuring access to adequate treatment options and reducing reliance on emergency medical services as the primary source of mental health treatment by individuals with a severe mental illness.
- → Section 3. The Severe Mental Illness Task Force shall be composed of the following members with final membership of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of the Legislative Research Commission:
- 21 (1) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of 22 the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be designated by the Speaker of the 23 House of Representatives as a co-chair of the task force;
- 24 (2) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Floor 25 Leader of the House of Representatives;
- 26 (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one of 27 whom shall be designated by the President of the Senate as a co-chair of the task force;

- 3 (5) The commissioner of the Department for Medicaid Services;
- 4 (6) The commissioner of the Department for Behavioral Health, Developmental
- 5 and Intellectual Disabilities;
- 6 (7) The commissioner of the Department of Corrections;
- 7 (8) The director of the Protection and Advocacy Division of the Department of
- 8 Public Advocacy;
- 9 (9) One mental health court judge, recommended by the Department of Specialty
- 10 Courts within the Administrative Office of the Courts;
- 11 (10) One representative from the Homeless and Housing Coalition of Kentucky;
- 12 and
- 13 (11) One board-certified psychiatric pharmacist recommended by the Kentucky
- 14 Pharmacists Association.
- → Section 4. The task force shall meet monthly during the 2021 Interim of the
- 16 General Assembly. The task force shall submit findings and recommendations to the
- 17 Legislative Research Commission for referral to the appropriate committees
- 18 by December 1, 2021.
- → Section 5. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
- 20 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the
- 21 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to
- designate a study completion date.

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
