1	A RESOLUTION adjourning the House of Representatives in honor and loving
2	memory of Jimmie Walker Greene.
3	WHEREAS, born in Detroit, Michigan, to the late Rease and Pearl Walker Greene,
4	Jimmie Greene would go on to become one of the most prominent citizens in the history
5	of McCreary County, Kentucky; and
6	WHEREAS, Jimmie Greene was a 1946 graduate of McCreary County High School
7	and a proud veteran of the Army Air Corps. He served in Japan during the Allied
8	Occupation, and flew recon, weather observation, and cargo missions during the Korean
9	and Vietnam Wars, retiring with 24 years of service as a Master Sergeant; and
10	WHEREAS, Jimmie Greene served as postmaster at Honeybee, Kentucky, until the
11	post office closed in 1977. He was an active member of Walkers Chapel Baptist Church,
12	where he served as the Sunday school superintendent; and
13	WHEREAS, Jimmie Greene was elected as the first Judge/Executive of McCreary
14	County in 1978, a position he held for a total of 17 years. He focused on infrastructure
15	and the county's economic vitality, and his deep patriotism and faith in the Lord were
16	instrumental to his success as an elected official; and
17	WHEREAS, a noted author, Judge Greene wrote a newspaper column called "The
18	Light Side of Parker's Lake," and was the author of many books, including his memoir,
19	Bridge Builder, which detailed his first term in office; and
20	WHEREAS, Judge Greene served as President of the McCreary County Chamber of
21	Commerce and Commander of the Charles Moore VFW Post 5127, was a lifetime
22	member of the Kinne-Slaven Post 115 of the American Legion, and remained active in
23	Republican politics throughout his extraordinary life; and
24	WHEREAS, Jimmie Walker Greene, beloved son of this Commonwealth and
25	cherished servant of Christ, departed this earthly life and entered into the kingdom of
26	Heaven on February 16, 2017, leaving his family, friends, and all those whose lives he
27	touched in solemn mourning; and
