1 A RESOLUTION recognizing and honoring the many 4-H members who have 2 traveled to the State Capital from throughout Kentucky to take part in a multitude of 3 civic, public policy, and educational activities as a part of the Kentucky 4-H: A Capitol 4 Experience.

5 WHEREAS, hundreds of youth in 4-H clubs and the 4-H Youth Development 6 Program are converging on the State Capital to take part in many activities aimed at 7 enhancing their understanding of the legislative process, state government, and the history 8 of this great Commonwealth; and

9 WHEREAS, while in the State Capital, the 4-H members will have the opportunity 10 to see their government in action, they will visit with legislators, attend committee 11 meetings, and, in turn, help give this General Assembly a greater awareness of the 12 importance of Kentucky's 4-H program; and

WHEREAS, the many 4-H clubs and the 4-H Youth Development Program are
sponsored by the cooperative extension programs of the University of Kentucky College
of Agriculture, Food, and Environment and Kentucky State University; and

WHEREAS, 4-H in Kentucky has a long and rich history beginning in the early
17 1900s when farm youth in the state were given the opportunity to try new practices on a
small portion of the family farm; and

WHEREAS, the 4-H Youth Development Program sponsors 4-H clubs in both rural
and urban areas of Kentucky, reaching almost 280,000 young people from ages 5 to 19;
and

WHEREAS, 4-H offers diverse programs that include leadership, citizenship, agriculture, family and consumer sciences, healthy lifestyles, communications and expressive arts, environment and natural resources, civic engagement, workforce development, science, engineering, technology, and practical life skills; and
