1 A RESOLUTION urging the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to utilize 2

- 3 wealth for persons enrolled in or applying for programs under the cabinet's oversight.
- 4 WHEREAS, the Cabinet for Health and Family Services monitors many complex
- 5 programs involving billions of taxpayer dollars; and
- 6 WHEREAS, many of the programs are based upon need and require initial
- 7 verification of applicants' eligibility and ongoing assessments of enrollees' eligibility;
- 8 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 9 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
- 10 Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 11 **→**Section 1. The House of Representatives urges the Cabinet for Health and
- 12 Family Services to utilize enhanced eligibility verification and periodic continuing
- 13 monitoring that is, at a minimum, quarterly, to ensure that the following information is
- 14 verified concerning enrollees and applicants:
- 15 Earned and unearned income: (1)
- 16 (2) Employment status and any changes in employment;
- 17 Immigration status; (3)
- 18 State residency status, including a nationwide best-address source to verify (4)
- 19 individuals are residents of Kentucky;
- 20 (5) Financial resources;
- 21 (6) Incarceration status;
- 22 (7) Death records;
- 23 Enrollment status in any public assistance programs administered by other
- 24 states or territories;
- 25 Potential identity fraud or identity theft;
- 26 (10) Lottery winnings; and
- 27 (11) Asset testing, including a nationwide public records data source of physical

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1 asset ownership such as real property, automobiles, watercraft, aircraft, and luxury

- 2 vehicles or other vehicles owned by the applicant or enrollee.
- 3 → Section 2. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services, when it receives
- 4 information that may impact an individual's eligibility for assistance programs, is urged to
- 5 take the following steps:
- 6 (1) Review the individual's case file to determine the impact the new information
- 7 has on the individual or household's eligibility;
- 8 (2) Provide written notice to the individual throughout the investigation;
- 9 (3) Provide opportunity to the individual to explain any discrepancies, including
- an opportunity for a hearing that complies with KRS Chapter 13B; and
- 11 (4) Discontinue assistance if there is a substantial risk of fraud, waste, or abuse
- 12 occurring in that case.
- → Section 3. For an individual using food stamps at a grocery store, the Cabinet
- 14 for Health and Family Services is urged to consider using methods to ensure that the
- benefits from that program go to benefit the household of the cardholder. These methods
- 16 may include requiring photographic identification be shown by any member of a
- 17 household using a benefits card.
- → Section 4. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services is urged to explore the
- 19 following options when updating its eligibility and monitoring infrastructure:
- 20 (1) Signing of memoranda of understanding or agreement with any state agency
- 21 necessary to share or acquire needed information;
- 22 (2) Use of independent vendors to provide the information if the agreement with
- 23 the a vendor includes a requirement of an annualized saving that exceeds the state's total
- 24 annual cost;
- 25 (3) Use of public or private grants to research the abuse of food stamps or other
- 26 public programs; and
- 27 (4) The use of multi-state collaborative agreements such as the National Accuracy

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1 Clearinghouse, to share information and pool staff or resources to better combat waste,

- 2 fraud, and abuse.
- **→** Section 5. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services is urged to:
- 4 (1) Refer suspected cases of fraud to the Office of the Inspector General for
- 5 investigation, criminal investigation, recovery of improper payments, and collection of
- 6 civil penalties.
- 7 (2) Refer suspected cases of identity fraud to the appropriate county attorney or
- 8 Commonwealth's attorney office for prosecution;
- 9 (3) If a case of suspected fraud has resulted in a conviction, review legal options
- 10 to remove an enrollee from other public assistance programs and garnish wages until an
- equal amount of the benefits fraudulently received is recovered.
- 12 (4) Refer any suspected cases of fraud, misrepresentation, or inadequate
- documentation discovered to the appropriate state or local agencies for review of
- eligibility discrepancies in any other public programs.
- → Section 6. The General Assembly urges that the resource limit standards of the
- food stamp program never exceed the standards specified in 7 U.S.C. sec. 2014(g)(1),
- 17 unless expressly required by federal law. In no case should categorical eligibility
- exempting households from these resource limits be granted for any non-cash, in-kind or
- other benefit, unless expressly required by federal law.
- 20 → Section 7. The General Assembly urges the Cabinet for Health and Family
- 21 Services to not seek, apply for, accept, or renew any waiver of the requirements
- established under 7 U.S.C. sec. 2015(o).
- → Section 8. The General Assembly recommends that the 1996 work requirements
- 24 established in federal welfare reform be utilized as a resource and policy goal as the
- benefits updates and technology updates are prepared and that these work requirements be
- restored or waivers requesting their restoration be prepared by the cabinet.
- → Section 9. The General Assembly urges that progress reports and final

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1 presentations about the updates and direction of benefits programs in Kentucky be given

- 2 to the Interim Joint Committee on Health and Welfare and the Medicaid Oversight and
- 3 Advisory Committee at the request of the chairs.
- 4 → Section 10. The General Assembly requests that all updates be completed,
- 5 legislation recommended, and any necessary waivers requested by December 31, 2018.
- Section 11. This Resolution shall be known as the Citizen and Taxpayer
- 7 Stewardship Resolution of 2017.
