A RESOLUTION commemorating Human Trafficking Awareness Day on January 11, 2020.

WHEREAS, the International Labor Organization estimates that there are more than 20 million victims of human trafficking worldwide, with hundreds of thousands of victims living in the United States; and

WHEREAS, victims of human trafficking live in fear and are often kept isolated, making them unaware of their rights, powerless to access services, and afraid to ask for help from local law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, human trafficking has been addressed by many different agencies and organizations, including the Kentucky Statewide Human Trafficking Taskforce, which was created with the implementation of the Human Trafficking Victims' Rights Act in 2013; and

WHEREAS, combating human trafficking requires a collaborative, comprehensive approach across all levels of government, and requires vigilance from the general public; and

WHEREAS, to this end, Human Trafficking Awareness Day was designated in 2007, and has served as a reminder to all citizens that human trafficking remains a vital issue that deserves every available resource to stop;

NOW, THEREFORE,

## Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the

## Commonwealth of Kentucky:

$\rightarrow$ Section 1. The members of the House of Representatives hereby commemorate Human Trafficking Awareness Day on January 11, 2020.
$\Rightarrow$ Section 2. The members recognize the importance of assisting the victims of human trafficking, of fighting human trafficking across the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and of helping recovering victims to be accepted back into their communities.
