1 AN ACT relating to underground facility protection.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 367.4903 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 As used in KRS 367.4903 to 367.4917:
- 5 (1) "Underground facility" means an underground line or system used for producing,
- storing, conveying, transmitting, or distributing telecommunications, electricity,
- gas, petroleum, petroleum products, cable television, hazardous liquids, water,
- 8 steam, or sewerage, including storm drainage;
- 9 (2) "Damage" means weakening of structural or lateral support or penetration of a
- facility coating, housing, or other protective device. It also means the partial or
- 11 complete dislocation or severance of underground facilities or rendering any
- underground facility permanently inaccessible by the placement of a permanent
- structure having one (1) or more stories;
- 14 (3) "Demolition" means any operation by which a structure or mass of material is
- wrecked, razed, moved, or removed by means of mechanized equipment, or
- discharge of explosives;
- 17 (4) "Excavator" means any entity or individual, other than those exempted by KRS
- 18 367.4915, engaged in excavation, demolition, or timber harvesting using
- mechanized equipment;
- 20 (5) "Operator" means any entity or individual owning or operating underground
- 21 facilities to serve the public;
- 22 (6) "Excavation" means any activity that results in the movement, placement, probing,
- boring, or removal of earth, rock, or other material in or on the ground by the use of
- any tools or equipment, by the discharge of explosives, or by the harvesting of
- 25 timber using mechanized equipment. Forms of excavating include but are not
- limited to auguring, backfilling, digging, ditching, drilling, driving, grading, piling,
- pulling-in, ripping, scraping, trenching, and tunneling. Driving wooden stakes by

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1		use of hand tools to a depth of six (6) inches or less below existing grade shall not
2		constitute excavation;
3	(7)	"Emergency" means there exists substantial likelihood that loss of life or property,
4		the inability to restore interrupted utility service, an imminent danger to health or
5		the environment, or the blockage of public transportation facilities will result before
6		procedures required under KRS 367.4909 to 367.4913 can be completed;
7	(8)	"Protection notification center" means an operator-provided notification center
8		through which an excavator can contact the operator to enable the operator to
9		provide the excavator with the approximate location of underground facilities;
10	(9)	"Kentucky Contact Center" means Kentucky Underground Protection, Inc.,
11		organized as a nonprofit corporation and a multimember protection notification
12		center providing a single telephone contact number and designated by the Kentucky
13		Public Service Commission to be the sole recipient of 811 dialed calls through
14		which an excavator may contact all Kentucky Contact Center members and all
15		affected operators may receive information to enable them to provide the excavator
16		with the approximate location of underground facilities;
17	(10)	"Routine road maintenance" means preservation, including road repairs and
18		resurfacing, and the replacement of signs, posts, and guardrails at the exact same
19		location when no additional penetration of existing grade is necessary, but does not
20		include road construction, installation of signs, posts, and guardrails, or any activity
21		that requires penetration of existing grade;
22	(11)	"Approximate location[,]" [when referring to an underground facility,]means:
23		(a) For <u>a normal excavation locate request</u> [underground metallic facilities and
24		underground nonmetallic facilities with metallic tracer wire], a marked area [a
25		distance] not to exceed the combined width of the underground facility plus
26		eighteen (18) inches measured from the outer edge of each side of the

underground facility; or

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1		(b) For an unmapped or unlocatable facility request, a marked area nonmetallic
2		facilities without metallic tracer wire, the underground facility] shall be
3		located as accurately as possible from field location records and shall require
4		notification from the operator of the inability to accurately locate the facility;
5	(12)	"Working day" means a twenty-four (24) hour period commencing from the time of
6		receipt of the notification by the Kentucky Contact Center except Saturday, Sunday,
7		and holidays established by federal or state statute;
8	(13)	"Nonintrusive excavating" means excavation using hand tools or equipment that
9		uses air or water pressure as the direct means to break up soil for removal by hand
10		tools or vacuum excavation;
11	(14)	"Mechanized equipment" means mechanical power equipment, including trenchers,
12		bulldozers, power shovels, augers, backhoes, scrapers, drills, cable and pipe plows,
13		skidders, and yarders;
14	(15)	"Normal excavation locate request" means a notification of planned excavation
15		made to the Kentucky Contact Center for a locatable underground facility [a
16		protection notification center where a request for locating utility facilities is
17		processed];
18	(16)	"Emergency locate request" means a notification made to a protection notification
19		center by an excavator to alert facility owners or operators of the need to begin
20		immediate excavation in response to an emergency;
21	(17)	"Design information request" means a notification made to a protection notification
22		center by a person providing professional services and making a request in
23		preparation for bidding, preconstruction engineering, or other advance planning
24		efforts. A design information request may not be used for excavation purposes;
25	(18)	"Large project" means an area of excavation occurring on or after July 1, 2016,
26		measuring more than two thousand (2,000) feet in length. Multiple excavation
27		notifications in an area may be considered together in determining if the

1		excavations are part of a large project; and
2	(19)	"Commission" means the Kentucky Public Service Commission:
3	<u>(20)</u>	"Positive response" means an automated communication system provided by the
4		Kentucky Contact Center that allows excavators, locators, operators, and other
5		interested parties to determine the status of locating an underground facility and
6		to verify that operators and excavators have complied with Sections 2 and 3 of
7		this Act;
8	<u>(21)</u>	"Unique identification number" or "locate request number" means a unique
9		number that the Kentucky Contact Center has assigned to a locate request for
10		excavation;
11	<u>(22)</u>	"Locator" means any entity or individual that locates lines or facilities for an
12		operator;
13	(23)	"Locatable facility" means an underground facility that can be located from the
14		surface using the current locating technology in an operator's industry; and
15	<u>(24)</u>	"Unlocatable facility" means an underground facility that cannot be located
16		from the surface using normal locating methods and requires additional efforts
17		and extended time.
18		→ Section 2. KRS 367.4909 is amended to read as follows:
19	(1)	An operator with underground facilities located in Kentucky shall become a
20		member of the Kentucky Contact Center. Operators who are members of the
21		Notification Center or a successor entity on the effective date of this Act shall
22		remain members. Operators of underground facilities used to produce, store,
23		convey, transmit, or distribute electricity, steam, natural or synthetic gas,
24		petroleum, or petroleum products who are not members on the effective date of
25		this Act shall join no later than December 31, 2021. Operators of underground
26		facilities used to produce, store, convey, transmit, or distribute
27		telecommunications service who are not members on the effective date of this Act

1		shall join no later than December 31, 2022. All other operators of underground
2		facilities, including but not limited to water, wastewater, and municipal utilities
3		shall join no later than December 31, 2023. After December 31, 2023, any
4		operator shall become a member of the Kentucky Contact Center within thirty
5		(30) days of becoming an operator with underground facilities located in
6		Kentucky [Each operator shall provide protection notification center access to
7		excavators].
8	(2)	After December 31, 2023, an excavator or any person involved in overseeing an
9		excavation, planning an excavation, or planning demolition work shall not be
10		liable for damages to underground facilities owned by nonmember operators, if
11		the excavator complied with the Underground Facilities Damage Prevention Act
12		of 1994, except for damages due to gross negligence or intentional misconduct of
13		an excavator [Voluntary Operator membership in the Kentucky Contact Center shall
14		satisfy the requirement of subsection (1) of this section].
15	(3)	Each operator [member of the Kentucky Contact Center]shall provide and update
16		as needed to the Kentucky Contact Center the general location of its underground
17		facilities, the operator identity and business address, and emergency notification
18		telephone numbers.
19	(4)	Each operator shall report to the commission excavation damage to an underground
20		facility used in the transportation of gas or hazardous liquid within thirty (30)
21		calendar days of being informed of the damage. Each report of excavation damage
22		shall be made by electronic mail or as otherwise prescribed by the commission.
23	(5)	An operator shall respond to facility locate requests and update the positive
24		<u>response system</u> as follows:
25		(a) To a normal excavation locate request, within two (2) working days after
26		receiving notification from an excavator, excluding large projects;
27		(b) To an unmapped or unlocatable facility request, within five (5) working

1			days after receiving notification from an excavator;
2		<u>(c)</u>	To an emergency locate request, as quickly as possible but not to exceed forty-
3			eight (48) hours after receiving notification from an excavator;
4		<u>(d)</u> [(To a design information request, within ten (10) working days after
5			receiving notification from the person making the request; and
6		<u>(e)</u> [(To a large project request, within five (5) working days from the later of
7			receiving notification from an excavator or the scheduled excavation start date
8			for that location.
9	(6)	An	operator shall, upon receiving an emergency locate request or a normal
10		exca	avation locate request:
11		(a)	Inform the excavator of the approximate location and description of any of the
12			operator's facilities that may be damaged or pose a safety concern because of
13			excavation or demolition;
14		(b)	Inform the excavator of any other information that would assist in locating
15			and avoiding contact with or damage to underground facilities;
16		(c)	Unless permanent facility markers are provided, provide temporary markings
17			to inform the excavator of the ownership and approximate location of the
18			underground facility; and
19		(d)	Notify the requesting party if underground facilities are not in conflict with the
20			excavation or demolition.
21	(7)	Upo	n receiving a design information request, an operator shall contact the person
22		mak	ing the request within the time period specified in subsection (5) of this section.
23		The	operator shall:
24		(a)	Designate with temporary underground facility markers the location of all
25			underground facilities owned by the operator within the area of the design
26			information request as defined in KRS 367.4903;
27		(b)	Provide to the person making the design information request a description of

1			all underground facilities owned by the operate	or in the area of the design
2			information request and the location of the fa	acilities, which may include
3			drawings marked with a scale, dimensions,	and reference points for
4			underground utilities already built in the area or	other facility records that are
5			maintained by the operator; or	
6		(c)	Allow the person making the design informati	on request or an authorized
7			person to inspect the drawings or other records	for all underground facilities
8			with the proposed area of excavation at a locat	ion that is acceptable to the
9			operator.	
10	(8)	An	operator may reject a design information re	quest based upon security
11		cons	iderations or if producing the information wi	ll place the operator at a
12		com	petitive disadvantage, pending the operator obta	ining additional information

1		from the Kentucky Contact Center shall confirm the status of the locate
2		request in the positive response system.
3	(2)	Locate requests are valid for twenty-one (21) calendar days from the day of the
4		initial request.
5	(3)	Each excavator shall provide each applicable protection notification center with
6		adequate information regarding:
7		(a) The name of the individual making the notification;
8		(b) The excavator's name, address, and a telephone number;
9		(c) The excavation or demolition site location or locations, each of which shall
10		not exceed two thousand (2,000) feet in length unless the excavator and
11		operator agree to a larger area, the city or community, county and street
12		address, including the nearest cross street;
13		(d) The type and extent of excavation or demolition to be performed;
14		(e) A contact name and telephone number of the person responsible for the work
15		to be performed.
16	(4)	If more than one (1) excavator will operate at the same site, each excavator shall
17		notify the protection notification centers individually. Notification by an excavator
18		will serve as notification for any of that excavator's employees. Failure by an
19		excavator to notify the protection notification center does not relieve individual
20		employees of responsibility.
21	(5)	The excavator shall inform and provide to excavation or demolition site employees:
22		(a) The underground facility location provided by each operator;
23		(b) Any related safety information provided by each operator; and
24		(c) The locate request identification number assigned by each protection
25		notification center.
26	(6)	The excavator shall protect and preserve temporary underground facility markers
27		until the scheduled excavation or demolition is completed.

1	(7)	If, after the two (2) day period provided by KRS 367.4909(5)(a), the excavator finds
2		evidence of an unmarked underground facility at the site, he shall immediately
3		notify the protection notification center.

- 4 (8) The excavator shall contact the protection notification center to request remarking 5 two (2) working days in advance of the expiration of each twenty-one (21) day 6 period while excavation or demolition continues or if:
- 7 (a) The markings of any underground facility have been removed or are no longer visible; or
- 9 (b) The excavator has changed the work plan or location previously filed.

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- 10 (9) (a) Each excavator who conducts or is responsible for any excavation or demolition that results in underground facility damage shall cease excavation or demolition activities and notify all affected operators of the location and nature of the underground facility damage.
 - (b) If the underground facility damage causes concern for public or workplace safety, the excavator shall notify appropriate public safety agencies of the location and nature of the safety concern.
 - (c) If the underground facility damage results in the escape of any flammable, toxic, or corrosive gas or liquid, the excavator shall cease excavation or demolition activities and immediately report to the appropriate authorities by calling the 911 emergency telephone number.
 - (10) When excavation or demolition is necessary within the approximate location of the underground facility, the excavator shall hand-dig or use nonintrusive means to avoid damage to the underground facility.
 - (11) Upon request by an operator or when the proposed excavation location cannot be accurately identified, an excavator shall mark the boundaries of the location to be excavated using the procedure set forth in KRS 367.4909(9)(k). After marking the boundaries, the excavator shall contact the protection notification center or centers.

The requirements of KRS 367.4909(5) to (II) are reestablished upon the
operator receiving notification of this marking from the protection notification
center or centers. This marking shall not alter, or relieve the excavator from
complying with, the requirements of KRS 367.4905 to 367.4917.

- → Section 4. KRS 367.4913 is amended to read as follows:

- 7 (a) Operate the protection notification center during all working days;
 - (b) Provide a locate request identification number to the excavator for each excavation or demolition location request;
 - (c) Promptly after receiving an excavation or demolition work notification from an excavator, provide to each of its affected operator members the excavator information required by KRS 367.4911(3);
 - (d) Maintain a list of all its operator <u>members</u>[member's identities], <u>their</u> business <u>addresses</u>, [address] and <u>their</u> business and emergency telephone numbers and [record this information in accordance with KRS 64.012 with the county clerk of each county where the operator member has underground facilities. The county clerk]shall provide this information upon request[for the actual cost of providing a copy, to be paid by the requesting party to the county clerk. The county clerk shall assume no liability associated with the receipt of this information from the protection notification center or for subsequent provision of this same information to the requesting party];
 - (e) Make the operator members information list available to any person for inspection at its place of business without charge or provide a copy of the list to any person for any county upon request for a fee not to exceed the actual cost of providing a copy;
