Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

3 → Section 1. KRS 189.635 is amended to read as follows:

- 4 The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet, Department of Kentucky State Police, shall (1) be responsible for maintaining a reporting system for all vehicle accidents which 5 6 occur within the Commonwealth. [Such] Accident reports shall be utilized for 7 such purposes as will improve the traffic safety program in the Commonwealth 8 involving the collection, processing, storing, and dissemination of accident[such] 9 data and the establishment of procedures by administrative regulations to ensure 10 that uniform definitions, classifications, and other federal requirements are in 11 compliance.
 - (2) Any person operating a vehicle on the highways of this state who is involved in an accident resulting in fatal or nonfatal personal injury to any person or damage to the vehicle rendering the vehicle inoperable shall be required to immediately notify a law enforcement officer having jurisdiction. In the event the operator fails to notify or is incapable of notifying a law enforcement officer having jurisdiction, *this*[such] responsibility shall rest with the owner of the vehicle or any occupant of the vehicle at the time of the accident. A law enforcement officer having jurisdiction shall investigate the accident and file a written report of the accident with his or her law enforcement agency.
 - (3) (a) Every law enforcement agency whose officers investigate a vehicle accident of which a report must be made as required in this chapter shall file a report of the accident with the Department of Kentucky State Police within ten (10) days after investigation of the accident upon forms supplied by the department.
 - (b) A law enforcement agency may retain a copy of the reports that the agency is required to submit to the Department of Kentucky State Police under

4	(4)	Any	person operating a vehicle on the highways of this state who is involved in an
5		acci	dent resulting in any property damage exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500) in
6		whic	ch an investigation is not conducted by a law enforcement officer shall file a
7		writ	ten report of the accident with the Department of Kentucky State Police within
8		ten (10) days of occurrence of the accident upon forms provided by the department.
9	(5)	(a)	All accident reports filed with the Department of Kentucky State Police in
10			compliance with subsection (4) of this section shall not be considered open
11			records under KRS 61.870 to 61.884 and shall remain confidential, except that
12			the department may:
13			1. Disclose the identity of a person involved in an accident when his or her
14			identity is not otherwise known or when he or she denies his or her
15			presence at an accident; and
16			2. Make the reports available:
17			a. To the persons named in paragraph (c) of this subsection; and
18			b. In accordance with subsection (8) of this section.
19		(b)	All other accident reports required by this section, and the information
20			contained in the reports, shall be confidential and exempt from public
21			disclosure under KRS 61.870 to 61.884, except when:
22			1. Produced pursuant to a properly executed subpoena or court order; or
23			2. Disclosed as provided in this section.
24		(c)	Accident reports shall be made available to:
25			1. The parties to the accident;
26			2. The parents or guardians of a minor who is party to the accident;
27			3. Insurers or their written designee for insurance business purposes of any

1			party who is the subject of the report;
2			4. The attorneys of the parties to the accident;
3			5. Any party to litigation who files with the department a request for the
4			report and includes a copy of the first page of a District or Circuit Court
5			clerk-stamped complaint naming all parties;[and]
6			6. The Department of Workplace Standards in the Education and Labor
7			Cabinet if the accident report is pertinent to an occupational safety and
8			health investigation; and
9			7. A law enforcement agency.
10	(6)	(a)	Except as provided for in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the department
11			shall not release accident reports for a commercial purpose.
12		(b)	Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the department or a law
13			enforcement agency may, as a matter of public safety, contract with an
14			outside entity and release unredacted vehicle damage data extracted from
15			accident reports to the entity if the data is used solely for the purpose of
16			providing the public a means of determining a vehicle's accident history. The
17			department or a law enforcement agency may further contract with a third
18			party to provide electronic access to reports for persons and entities who are
19			entitled to the reports under subsection (5) of this section.
20	(7)	The	department shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with
21		KRS	Chapter 13A to set out a fee schedule for accident reports made available
22		pursi	uant to subsections (5) and (8) of this section. These fees shall be in addition to
23		those	charged to the public for records produced under KRS Chapter 61.
24	(8)	(a)	The report shall be made available to a news-gathering organization, solely
25			for the purpose of publishing or broadcasting the news. The news-gathering
26			organization shall not use or distribute the report, or knowingly allow its use
27			or distribution, for a commercial purpose other than the news-gathering

1		orga	anizati	on's publication or broadcasting of the information in the report.
2	(b)	For	the pu	urposes of this subsection:
3		1.	"Ne	ws-gathering organization" includes:
4			a.	A newspaper or periodical if it:
5				i. Is published at least fifty (50) of fifty-two (52) weeks during
6				a calendar year;
7				ii. Contains at least twenty-five percent (25%) news content in
8				each issue or no more than seventy-five percent (75%)
9				advertising content in any issue in the calendar year; and
10				iii. Contains news of general interest to its readers that can
11				include news stories, editorials, sports, weddings, births, and
12				death notices;
13			b.	A television or radio station with a valid broadcast license issued
14				by the Federal Communications Commission;
15			c.	A news organization that broadcasts over a multichannel video
16				programming service as defined in KRS 136.602;
17			d.	A website [Web site] published by or affiliated with any entity
18				described in subdivision a., b., or c. of this subparagraph;
19			e.	An online-only newspaper or magazine that publishes news or
20				opinion of interest to a general audience and is not affiliated with
21				any entity described in subparagraph 2. of this paragraph; and
22			f.	Any other entity that publishes news content by any means to the
23				general public or to members of a particular profession or
24				occupational group; and
25		2.	"Ne	ws-gathering organization" does not include any product or
26			pub	lication with the primary purpose of distributing advertising or of
27			pub	lishing names and other personal identifying information concerning

3	(c)	A news-gathering organization shall not be held to have used or knowingly
4		allowed the use of the report for a commercial purpose merely because of its
5		publication or broadcast.
6	(d)	A request under this subsection shall be completed using a form promulgated
7		by the department through administrative regulations in accordance with KRS
8		Chapter 13A. The form under this paragraph shall include:
9		1. The name and address of the requestor and the news-gathering
10		organization the requestor represents;
11		2. A statement that the requestor is a news-gathering organization under
12		this subsection and identifying the specific subdivision of paragraph
13		(b)1. of this subsection under which the requester qualifies;
14		3. A statement that the request is in compliance with the criteria contained
15		in this section; and
16		4. A declaration of the requestor as to the accuracy and truthfulness of the
17		information provided in the request.
18	(e)	1. The department shall redact all personal information from a report prior
19		to making it available to a news-gathering organization as defined under
20		paragraph (b)1.f. of this subsection.
21		2. Reports may be provided to news-gathering organizations as defined
22		under paragraph (b)1.a. to e. of this subsection without redaction.
23		3. For the purposes of this paragraph, "personal information" means:
24		a. The address, driver's license number, phone number, date of birth,
25		and any other contact information contained in the report for each
26		person listed on the report; and
27		b. The vehicle identification <u>number (VIN)[numbers (VINs)]</u> for

each vehicle listed on the re

(9) The motor vehicle insurers of any train engineer or other train crew member involved in an accident on a railroad while functioning in their professional capacity shall be prohibited from obtaining a copy of any accident report filed on the accident under this section without written consent from the individual the company insures. Insurance companies issuing motor vehicle policies in the Commonwealth shall be prohibited from raising a policyholder's rates solely because the policyholder, in his or her professional capacity, is a train engineer or other train crew member involved in an accident on a railroad.

(10) For reporting and statistical purposes, motor scooters and autocycles as defined in KRS 186.010 shall be listed as a distinct category and shall not be considered to be a motor vehicle or a motorcycle for reports issued under this section.
