1	AN ACT relating to vehicle accident reports.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→ Section 1. KRS 189.635 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1) As used in this section:
5	(a) "Department" means the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet, Department of
6	Kentucky State Police; and
7	(b) "Law enforcement agency" means any unit of government listed in KRS
8	15.380 that employs a certified peace officer.
9	(2) The department[,] shall be responsible for maintaining a reporting system for all
10	vehicle accidents which occur within the Commonwealth.[Such] Accident reports
11	shall be utilized for[such] purposes as will improve the traffic safety program in the
12	Commonwealth involving the collection, processing, storing, and dissemination of
13	accident[such] data and the establishment of procedures by administrative
14	regulations to ensure that uniform definitions, classifications, and other federal
15	requirements are in compliance.
16	(3)[(2)] Any person operating a vehicle on the highways of this state who is involved
17	in an accident resulting in fatal or nonfatal personal injury to any person or damage
18	to the vehicle rendering the vehicle inoperable shall be required to immediately
19	notify a law enforcement officer having jurisdiction. In the event the operator fails
20	to notify or is incapable of notifying a law enforcement officer having jurisdiction,
21	this[such] responsibility shall rest with the owner of the vehicle or any occupant of
22	the vehicle at the time of the accident. A law enforcement officer having
23	jurisdiction shall investigate the accident and file a written report of the accident
24	with his or her law enforcement agency.
25	(4)[(3)] (a) Every law enforcement agency whose officers investigate a vehicle
26	accident of which a report must be made as required in this chapter shall file a
27	report of the accident with the department of Kentucky State Police within

1		ten (10) days after investigation of the accident upon forms supplied by the
2		department.
3	<u>(b)</u>	A law enforcement agency may retain a copy of the reports that the agency
4		is required to submit to the department under paragraph (a) of this
5		subsection. Reports retained by a law enforcement agency under this
6		subsection shall not be considered open records under KRS 61.870 to
7		61.884 and shall remain confidential, except as provided in this section.
8		Nothing in this subsection is intended to impose greater limitations on
9		disclosure of vehicle accident reports on law enforcement agencies than
10		those imposed on the department by this section.
11	<u>(5)</u> [(4)]	Any person operating a vehicle on the highways of this state who is involved
12	in a	n accident resulting in any property damage exceeding five hundred dollars
13	(\$50	00) in which an investigation is not conducted by a law enforcement officer
14	shal	I file a written report of the accident with the department[of Kentucky State
15	Poli	ce] within ten (10) days of occurrence of the accident upon forms provided by
16	the	department.
17	<u>(6)</u> [(5)]	(a) All accident reports filed with the department[of Kentucky State Police]
18		in compliance with subsection $(5)[(4)]$ of this section shall not be considered
19		open records under KRS 61.870 to 61.884 and shall remain confidential,
20		except that the department may:
21		1. Disclose the identity of a person involved in an accident when his or her
22		identity is not otherwise known or when he or she denies his or her
23		presence at an accident; and
24		2. Make the reports available:
25		a. To the persons named in paragraph (c) of this subsection; and
26		b. In accordance with subsection $(9)[(8)]$ of this section.
27	(b)	All other accident reports required by this section, and the information

1		contained in the reports, shall be confidential and exempt from public
2		disclosure under KRS 61.870 to 61.884, except when:
3		1. Produced pursuant to a properly executed subpoena or court order; or
4		2. Disclosed as provided in this section.
5	(c)	Accident reports shall be made available to:
6		1. The parties to the accident;
7		2. The parents or guardians of a minor who is party to the accident;
8		3. Insurers or their written designee for insurance business purposes of any
9		party who is the subject of the report;
10		4. The attorneys of the parties to the accident;
11		5. Any party to litigation who files with the department a request for the
12		report and includes a copy of the first page of a District or Circuit Court
13		clerk-stamped complaint naming all parties;[and]
14		6. The Department of Workplace Standards in the Education and Labor
15		Cabinet if the accident report is pertinent to an occupational safety and
16		health investigation; and
17		7. A law enforcement agency, subject to the limitations in subsections
18		(4)(b) and (7) of this section.
19	<u>(7)</u> [(6)]	(a) Except as provided for in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the
20		department or a law enforcement agency shall not release accident reports for
21		a commercial purpose.
22	(b)	Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the department or a law
23		enforcement agency may, as a matter of public safety, contract with an
24		outside entity and release unredacted vehicle damage data extracted from
25		accident reports to the entity if the data is used solely for the purpose of
26		providing the public a means of determining a vehicle's accident history. The
27		department or a law enforcement agency may further contract with a third

1		party to p	rovide	e electronic access to reports for persons and entities who are
2		entitled to	the re	eports under subsection (6) {(5)} of this section.
3	<u>(8)</u> [(7)]	The depart	rtmen	t shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance
4	with	KRS Chap	ter 13	A to set out a fee schedule for accident reports made available
5	purs	uant to sub	sectio	ns (6) and (9) and (9) of this section. These fees shall be in
6	addi	tion to thos	e char	ged to the public for records produced under KRS Chapter 61.
7	<u>(9)</u> [(8)]	(a) The	repor	t shall be made available to a news-gathering organization,
8		solely for	the j	purpose of publishing or broadcasting the news. The news-
9		gathering	orgar	nization shall not use or distribute the report, or knowingly
10		allow its	use oi	distribution, for a commercial purpose other than the news-
11		gathering	organ	ization's publication or broadcasting of the information in the
12		report.		
13	(b)	For the pu	rpose	s of this subsection:
14		1. "Ne	ws-ga	thering organization" includes:
15		a.	A ne	ewspaper or periodical if it:
16			i.	Is published at least fifty (50) of fifty-two (52) weeks during
17				a calendar year;
18			ii.	Contains at least twenty-five percent (25%) news content in
19				each issue or no more than seventy-five percent (75%)
20				advertising content in any issue in the calendar year; and
21			iii.	Contains news of general interest to its readers that can
22				include news stories, editorials, sports, weddings, births, and
23				death notices;
24		b.	A te	levision or radio station with a valid broadcast license issued
25			by tl	ne Federal Communications Commission;
26		c.	A n	ews organization that broadcasts over a multichannel video
27			prog	gramming service as defined in KRS 136.602;

1		d. A <u>website</u> [Web site] published by or affiliated with any entity
2		described in subdivision a., b., or c. of this subparagraph;
3		e. An online-only newspaper or magazine that publishes news or
4		opinion of interest to a general audience and is not affiliated with
5		any entity described in subparagraph 2. of this paragraph; and
6		f. Any other entity that publishes news content by any means to the
7		general public or to members of a particular profession or
8		occupational group; and
9		2. "News-gathering organization" does not include any product or
10		publication with the primary purpose of distributing advertising or of
11		publishing names and other personal identifying information concerning
12		parties to motor vehicle accidents which may be used to solicit for
13		services covered under Subtitle 39 of KRS Chapter 304.
14	(c)	A news-gathering organization shall not be held to have used or knowingly
15		allowed the use of the report for a commercial purpose merely because of its
16		publication or broadcast.
17	(d)	A request under this subsection shall be completed using a form promulgated
18		by the department through administrative regulations in accordance with KRS
19		Chapter 13A. The form under this paragraph shall include:
20		1. The name and address of the requestor and the news-gathering
21		organization the requestor represents;
22		2. A statement that the requestor is a news-gathering organization under
23		this subsection and identifying the specific subdivision of paragraph
24		(b)1. of this subsection under which the requester qualifies;
25		3. A statement that the request is in compliance with the criteria contained
26		in this section; and
27		4. A declaration of the requestor as to the accuracy and truthfulness of the

2		(e)	1.	The o	department shall redact all personal information from a report prior
3				to ma	aking it available to a news-gathering organization as defined under

5			2.	Repo	rts may be provided to news-gathering organizations as defined

- (j) Any board, commission, committee, subcommittee, ad hoc committee, advisory committee, council, or agency, except for a committee of a hospital medical staff, established, created, and controlled by a public agency as defined in paragraph (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), or (k) of this subsection; and

16			public records in the public agency's computer system.
17		(b)	"Software" consists of the operating system, application programs,
18			procedures, routines, and subroutines such as translators and utility programs,
19			but does not include that material which is prohibited from disclosure or
20			copying by a license agreement between a public agency and an outside entity
21			which supplied the material to the agency;
22	(4)	(a)	"Commercial purpose" means the direct or indirect use of any part of a public
23			record or records, in any form, for sale, resale, solicitation, rent, or lease of a
24			service, or any use by which the user expects a profit either through

commission, salary, or fee.

27 1. Publication or related use of a public record by a newspaper or

2		2. Use of a public record by a radio or television station in its news or

7	(5)	"Official custodian" means the chief administrative officer or any other officer or
8		employee of a public agency who is responsible for the maintenance, care and
9		keeping of public records, regardless of whether such records are in his actual
10		personal custody and control;
11	(6)	"Custodian" means the official custodian or any authorized person having personal
12		custody and control of public records;
13	(7)	"Media" means the physical material in or on which records may be stored or
14		represented, and which may include, but is not limited to paper, microform, disks,
15		diskettes, optical disks, magnetic tapes, and cards;
16	(8)	"Mechanical processing" means any operation or other procedure which is
17		transacted on a machine, and which may include, but is not limited to a copier,
18		computer, recorder or tape processor, or other automated device;
19	(9)	"Booking photograph and photographic record of inmate" means a photograph or
20		image of an individual generated by law enforcement for identification purposes
21		when the individual is booked into a detention facility as defined in KRS 520.010
22		or photograph and image of an inmate taken pursuant to KRS 196.099; and
