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1 AN ACT relating to student health services.

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Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 156.501 is amended to read as follows:
- The Department of Education shall provide leadership and assistance to local school districts relating to student health services. The department, working in cooperation with the Department for Public Health, shall provide, contract for services, or identify resources to improve student health services, including but not limited to the following:
 - (a) Standardized protocols and guidelines for health procedures to be performed by *licensed* health professionals and *unlicensed* school personnel. The protocols and guidelines shall include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. The delegation of nursing functions consistent with administrative regulations promulgated by the Kentucky Board of Nursing;
 - 2. Training of designated <u>unlicensed</u>[nonmedical] school personnel; and
 - 3. Appropriate documentation and recordkeeping including, but not limited to, notification to school administrators and parents or guardians of the provision of health services by a school employee, including certification of medical necessity for health services signed by a health care professional, and informed consent for the provision of health services by a parent or guardian.

A copy of the protocols and guidelines shall be made available <u>electronically</u> to each school in the Commonwealth and shall be <u>on the school district's</u>

<u>Web site</u>[maintained by each school in the school's library];

- (b) Consultation, technical assistance, and development of quality improvement measures for the state and local boards of education, individual public schools, and local health departments;
- 27 (c) By June 1 of each year, provide training to school district personnel to

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1		<u>facilitate</u> [Facilitation of] statewide and local data collection <u>using the</u>
2		Kentucky Student Information System. Data collected shall include school
3		health service office visits, the disposition of a student after the visit, and the
4		reporting of <u>all</u> school health services <u>provided to students</u> ; and
5		(d) Information, [and] resources, and research based on best practices for [that
6		relate to] the provision of school health services.
7	(2)	The Department of Education shall establish a position to assist in carrying out the
8		responsibilities required under subsection (1) of this section. The position may be
9		established with existing personnel resources, or by contract, with an individual
10		who:
11		(a) Holds, at a minimum, a bachelor's degree in nursing with a master's degree in
12		nursing or a related field from an accredited postsecondary institution; and
13		(b) Is a registered nurse licensed under the provisions of KRS Chapter 314.
14	(3)	The Department of Education shall provide fifty percent (50%) of the costs for the
15		position required by subsection (2) of this section and the Department for Public
16		Health shall provide the remaining fifty percent (50%) for the position. The
17		Department of Education may enter into a contractual arrangement, such as a
18		Memorandum of Agreement, with the Department for Public Health to share the
19		costs.
