 10 commonly applicable to the general workforce or civilian employees that is
 10 not unique to law enforcement activities or the exercise of peace officer

 13 enforcement department or agency within the unit of government employing
 14 the officer;
 - (d) "Professional malfeasance" means engaging in an act in one's professional capacity as a peace officer that violates a federal, state, or local law or regulation;
 - (e) "Professional nonfeasance" means a failure to perform one's professional duty as a peace officer through omission or inaction that violates a federal, state, or local law or regulation; and

- 1. A federal or state administrative regulation adopted by a federal or state executive branch; and
- 2. A local rule, regulation, policy, or procedure adopted by ordinance, 25 order, or resolution, or other official action by an agency. However, 26 "regulation" does not mean a general employment policy.
- 27 (2) (a) The certification of a peace officer shall be revoked by the council for one (1)
