1	AN ACT relating to deficient administrative regulations and declaring an
2	emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 13A IS CREATED TO
5	READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) The General Assembly finds that the following emergency administrative
7	regulations were found deficient pursuant to KRS 13A.030, on or after March 30,
8	2023, and before April 15, 2024, as evidenced by the records of the Legislative
9	<u>Research Commission:</u>
10	(a) 907 KAR 1:038E, Hearing Program Coverage Provisions and
11	<u>Requirements;</u>
12	(b) 907 KAR 1:126E, Dental Services' Coverage Provisions and Requirements;
13	<u>and</u>
14	(c) 907 KAR 1:632E, Vision Program Coverage Provisions and Requirements.
15	(2) Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
16	notwithstanding, the emergency administrative regulations referenced in
17	subsection (1) of this section shall be null, void, and unenforceable as of the
18	effective date of this Act.
19	(3) Contrary provisions of any section of the Kentucky Revised Statutes
20	notwithstanding, the administrative body shall be prohibited from promulgating
21	administrative regulations that are identical to, or substantially the same as, the
22	emergency administrative regulations referenced in subsection (1) of this section
23	for a period beginning on January 2, 2024, and concluding on June 1, 2025.
24	(4) The emergency administrative regulations referenced in subsection (1) of this
25	section shall be available to the public, in the office of the Legislative Research
26	Commission's regulations compiler.
27	Section 2. Whereas it is crucial that the Commonwealth's regulatory policy \mathbf{F}

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- 1 reflect the statutory intent of the General Assembly, an emergency is declared to exist,
- and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon itsotherwise becoming a law.
