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1	AN ACT relating to sessions of the General Assembly.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 6 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) Regular sessions of the General Assembly in odd-numbered years shall consist of
6	thirty (30) legislative days, and the use of these thirty (30) days shall not extend
7	beyond March 31.
8	(2) Regular sessions of the General Assembly in even-numbered years shall consist
9	of sixty (60) legislative days, and the use of these sixty (60) days shall not extend
10	beyond April 15.
11	(3) Should the General Assembly reconvene upon Joint Proclamation of the
12	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the
13	General Assembly shall meet for no more than twelve (12) legislative days, and
14	these legislative days shall occur during no more than three (3) calendar weeks in
15	the aggregate. This subsection shall not apply during any unpaid veto recess
16	period which shall be for no more than twelve (12) calendar days, followed by a
17	single legislative day. As used in this subsection, "calendar week" shall begin on
18	Monday and end on Saturday.
19	(4) All periods of time when the General Assembly is not in session after March 31 in
20	odd-numbered years, April 15 in even-numbered years, or upon Joint
21	Proclamation of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
22	<u>Representatives shall be interim periods for purposes of compensation,</u>
23	authorized expenses, legislative ethics, campaign finance, and actions relating to
24	regulations, contracts, or other legislative duties related to the executive branch.
25	(5) Any bill filed prior to March 31 in an odd-numbered year, or April 15 in an even-
26	numbered year, shall hold over for purposes of legislative action until December
27	31 of the year in which it was filed, or until all available legislative days have

2	<u>(6)</u>	Not	hing in this section shall be construed to apply to any extraordinary session of
3		the	General Assembly convened under Section 80 of the Constitution of
4		Ken	tucky.
5		→s	ection 2. KRS 6.190 is amended to read as follows:
6	<u>(1)</u>	Exc	ept as provided in subsection (5) of this section [beginning as of January 1,
7		198/	4], during any regular session of the General Assembly held between the first
8		Tue	sday following the first Monday in January and March 31 in odd-numbered
9		<u>year</u>	rs, and April 15 in even-numbered years:
10		<u>(a)</u>	The members of the General Assembly, other than the Speaker of the House
11			of Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Speaker Pro Tempore of
12			the House of Representatives, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the
13			majority and minority leadership of each house of the General Assembly, shall
14			each receive as compensation one hundred dollars (\$100) per day;[,]
15		<u>(b)</u>	The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives
16			shall each receive as compensation one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125) per
17			day <u>;</u> [,]
18		<u>(c)</u>	The majority and minority floor leaders of each house of the General
19			Assembly shall each receive as compensation one hundred twenty dollars
20			(\$120) per day <u>;</u> [,] and
21		<u>(d)</u>	The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker Pro Tempore, and the
22			majority and minority caucus <i>chairs</i> [chairmen] and whips of each house of
23			the General Assembly shall each receive as compensation one hundred fifteen
24			dollars (\$115) per day [, during the session of the General Assembly] .
25	<u>(2)</u>	Dur	ing any session of the General Assembly convened upon Joint Proclamation
26		<u>of t</u> l	he President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
27		<u>and</u>	except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, the members of the

1		General Assembly shall receive as compensation the amounts specified under
2		subsection (1) of this section for each calendar day on which the General
3		Assembly meets.
4	<u>(3)</u>	In addition to his <i>or her</i> compensation as a member of the General Assembly, each
5		chair [chairman] of a standing committee of the House of Representatives or the
6		Senate shall receive compensation of ten dollars (\$10) for each regularly scheduled
7		meeting of the standing committee which the member[he] chairs during sessions of
8		the General Assembly.
9	(4)	Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section [beginning as of July 1, 1980],
10		each member of the General Assembly shall receive mileage and reimbursement of
11		road tolls for one (1) round trip for each week of the session actually traveled
12		between the member's [his] home and the State Capitol during regular sessions, for
13		any session convened upon Joint Proclamation of the President of the Senate and
14		the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and extraordinary sessions of the
15		General Assembly and the necessary travel in going to and returning from the
16		sessions of their respective houses. The mileage allowance under this section shall
17		be equal to the maximum mileage allowance permitted by the federal government,
18		to be increased as federal mileage allowance is increased.
19	<u>(5)</u>	In the event of an extraordinary session called under Section 80 of the
20		Constitution of Kentucky, or any session convened upon Joint Proclamation of
21		the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, no
22		compensation or expense reimbursement authorized under this section shall be
23		paid to any member during those days declared as veto days by the General
24		Assembly. This provision shall not prohibit the payment of the expense allowance
25		provided under KRS 6.213.
26	<u>(6)</u>	As used in this section, "veto day" means any day in which neither chamber
27		meets while awaiting gubernatorial action on legislation enacted during that

1		session.
2		→Section 3. KRS 6.211 is amended to read as follows:
3	<u>(1)</u>	Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section [effective January 1, 1994], in
4		addition to any and all sums, compensation, or expenses now paid the members of
5		the General Assembly, each shall receive an expense allowance of one hundred ten
6		percent (110%) of the expense allowance paid federal employees traveling in the
7		Frankfort, Kentucky area for each calendar day. This sum shall be paid whether the
8		General Assembly is in regular or extraordinary session and shall be in full
9		recompense of any additional expenses incurred in excess of that now received by
10		them.
11	(2)	For any extraordinary session called under Section 80 of the Constitution of
12		Kentucky, or any session convened upon Joint Proclamation of the President of
13		the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, no additional
14		expense allowance authorized under this section shall be paid to any member
15		during those days declared as veto days by the General Assembly. This provision
16		shall not prohibit the payment of the expense allowance under KRS 6.213.
17	<u>(3)</u>	As used in this section, "veto day" means any day in which neither chamber
18		meets while awaiting gubernatorial action on legislation enacted during that
19		session.
20		\Rightarrow Section 4. This Act shall take effect only upon the ratification, in the regular
21	elect	tion of November 8, 2022, of a constitutional amendment relating to sessions of the
22	Gen	eral Assembly, including sessions convened upon Joint Proclamation of the President
23	of th	he Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. If such an amendment is
24	not	catified, this Act shall be void.

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
