2	WHEREAS, certificate of need (CON) laws are state regulatory mechanisms for		
3	approving major capital expenditures and projects for certain health care facilities; and		
4	WHEREAS, Kentucky first enacted CON laws in 1972, and the federal government		
5	required states to adopt CON laws according to a federal model in 1974; and		
6	WHEREAS, the federal mandate was repealed in 1987, but 35 states and the		
7	District of Columbia maintain some form of a CON program covering a range of health		
8	services and requirements; and		
9	WHEREAS, Kentucky's CON requirements for creating or expanding health car		
10	facilities and services in specified areas are included in statute and in the state healt		
11	plan; and		
12	WHEREAS, as of 2021, 12 states have fully repealed their CON programs or		
13	allowed their programs to expire, and three states do not operate a CON program but		
14	maintain several approval processes that function similarly to CON; and		
15	WHEREAS, in 2021, Montana exempted all facilities except long-term care		
16	facilities from CON review; and		
17	WHEREAS, the primary purpose of CON programs is to control health care costs		
18	by restricting duplicative services and determining whether new capital expenditure		
19	meet a community need; and		
20	WHEREAS, the need for some health facilities and services is not being met in		
21	several geographic areas of Kentucky which puts into question the effectiveness of the		
22	current CON process;		
23	NOW, THEREFORE,		
24	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of		
25	Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein:
