1 A JOINT RESOLUTION directing the Cabinet for Health and Family Services and 2 the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet to work together with the Administrative Office of 3 the Courts to create recommendations related to partnerships for decriminalization, 4 diversion programs, and the funding of drug courts.

5 WHEREAS, drug courts are alternative courts for people whose substance abuse 6 problems with drugs or alcohol are the primary cause of the crimes with which they are 7 charged. Instead of spending time in jail or on traditional probation, offenders who come 8 through drug courts undergo a rigorous substance abuse treatment program under a 9 judge's supervision; and

WHEREAS, there are approximately 21,000 individuals that are incarcerated within Kentucky's jails and prisons. There are an additional 50,000 individuals under some sort of supervision through probation and parole. Research shows sixty to seventy percent of these individuals have some form of a substance use disorder and are in need of treatment and assessment; and

WHEREAS, the rate at which released inmates in Kentucky get re-arrested was
over 32 percent in 2016; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, a five-year \$8.8 million grant was awarded to the Kentucky Department of Corrections in conjunction with the University of Kentucky to expand programming within jails. The goal is to improve capacity of justice system response to substance use disorder. Kentucky is one of ten states chosen for the grant and will focus on women in jails; and

WHEREAS, currently the Department of Corrections offers six different substance
use disorder treatment options that are able to serve 6,161 individuals arrested for drug
offenses; and

WHEREAS, around seventy-five percent of inmates in a state prison or local jail who suffer from substance use disorder also suffer from mental health conditions;

27 NOW, THEREFORE,

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1 Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

2 →Section 1. The General Assembly hereby directs the Cabinet for Health and
3 Family Services and the Justice and Public Safety Cabinet to work together with the
4 Administrative Office of the Courts to create recommendations for the legislature related
5 to partnerships for decriminalization, diversion programs, and the funding of drug courts.

Section 2. The work group shall meet during 2021 and shall submit findings
and recommendations to the Legislative Research Commission for referral to the
appropriate committee or committees by December 1, 2021.
