- WHEREAS, it is appropriate that this body celebrate those historic achievements which shape and mold the very fabric of our society, and which serve as beacons of hope for future generations of Kentuckians and Americans; and
- WHEREAS, on August 26, 1920, the 19th Amendment was officially ratified, ending a decades-long movement to secure women's right to vote at both state and national levels; and
- WHEREAS, the year 2020, being the centennial of this historic event, will be rightfully celebrated as a testament to both how far women have come as forces of change in all areas of daily life, and also as a crucial reminder of the struggle for suffrage that culminated in the ratification of the 19th Amendment; and
- WHEREAS, in so doing, the members of this body, and all citizens of this great
 Commonwealth, pause on this day to reflect on the struggle for women's suffrage and to
 duly champion those courageous women who fought so hard for so long to procure the
 right to vote;

- 18 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of 19 Kentucky:
- Section 1. The members of the Senate hereby recognize the 100th anniversary of the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution.
- Section 2. The Senate honors those women whose names are etched in history and who served—often at great personal and professional expense—on the front lines of the women's suffrage movement.
- Section 3. The Senate acknowledges the work of the League of Women Voters of Kentucky, and commends them for the work they continue to do on behalf of this Commonwealth's women.
