1	A RESOLUTION honoring and remembering Private Franklin Runyon Sousley on
2	the 75th anniversary of his participation in hoisting the United States flag at Iwo Jima
3	during World War II.
4	WHEREAS, Private Franklin Runyon Sousley, a native of Fleming County, was a
5	member of the United States Marine Corps during World War II; and
6	WHEREAS, Private Sousley bravely fought in the battle for control of the island of
7	Iwo Jima as a member of the 3rd Platoon, Echo Company, 28th Regiment, 5th Marine
8	Division; and
9	WHEREAS, Private Sousley was one of five Marines and a Navy corpsman who
10	were immortalized in Associate Press photographer Joe Rosenthal's photograph of the
11	United States flag raising on Mount Suribachi, just after noon on February 23, 1945, the
12	fourth day of the battle; and
13	WHEREAS, the flag's location on the top of Mount Suribachi was a rallying point
14	for the Marines fighting in that battle as well as for Americans on the home front,
15	becoming the symbol used during the Seventh War Bond drive; and
16	WHEREAS, Private Sousley's honor, courage, and commitment greatly attributed to
17	the success of the 36-day assault on the eight-mile island. His service to country and
18	Corps was reflective of the more than 100,000 sailors and Marines who served on the
19	island, the sacrifice of the 18,070 wounded, and the 6,891 who were killed in action; and
20	WHEREAS, Private Sousley was fatally shot on March 21, 1945, a victim of
21	Japanese sniper fire on Iwo Jima, less than one month after the flag raising; and
22	WHEREAS, Private Sousley was one of the last Marines to die in the battle; and
23	WHEREAS, Private Sousley's selfless heroism and participation in an iconic
24	moment of World War II contributed to the United States of America defeating Japan and
25	ending the war in the Pacific. His actions will forever be remembered by family, friends,
26	and a grateful nation; and
27	WHEREAS, Sunday, February 23, 2020, marked the 75th anniversary of the

historic flag raising on Iwo Jima, and an entire Commonwealth stands in grateful
 recognition of this historic event, and in solemn reverence for great Kentuckian Private
 Franklin Runyon Sousley;

5 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
6 Kentucky:

7 → Section 1. The Senate hereby honors and remembers the ultimate sacrifice paid
8 by Private Franklin Runyon Sousley, and acknowledges the 75th anniversary of the
9 historic flag-raising during the Battle for Iwo Jima on February 23, 1945.

10 → Section 2. When the Senate adjourns this day, it does so in honor and
11 remembrance of Private Franklin Runyon Sousley.

12 → Section 3. The Clerk of the Senate is directed to transmit a copy of this
13 Resolution to Senator Stephen West.
