1	A RESOLUTION recognizing April 11 to 17, 2024, as Black Maternal Health
2	Week in Kentucky.
3	WHEREAS, the maternal mortality rate is defined as the number of women who die
4	during pregnancy, child delivery, or within 42 days of giving birth from a cause related to
5	pregnancy; and
6	WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported that in 2021
7	the maternal mortality rate for all women was 32.9 per 100,000 births, 69.9 per 100,000
8	births for Black women, and 26.6 per 100,000 births for white women; and
9	WHEREAS, risk factors for maternal mortality include depression, obesity, tobacco
10	or substance abuse, and other social measures such as limited access to transportation or
11	health care services; and
12	WHEREAS, more than 80 percent of pregnancy-related complications are
13	preventable, and Black women make up more than 31 percent of women with pregnancy-
14	related complications; and
15	WHEREAS, in 2021 the maternal mortality rate for all women in Kentucky was
16	38.4 per 100,000 births. While 2021 rates by race are not available for Kentucky, in 2018
17	the maternal mortality rate for Black women was 40.2 per 100,000 births, three times
18	higher than the maternal mortality rate of 13 per 100,000 births for white women; and
19	WHEREAS, the Black Mamas Matter Alliance is dedicated to raising awareness,
20	inspiring activism, and building community support for the policies and issues
21	surrounding the health and rights of Black mothers and their families; and
22	WHEREAS, April is National Minority Health Month and April 11, 2024, is the
23	International Day for Maternal Health and Rights;
