1	A RESOLUTION opposing the United States' participation in the World Health
2	Organization Pandemic Agreement.
3	WHEREAS, the World Health Organization's negotiated the draft Pandemic
4	Agreement in November 2023, and is set to adopt the final agreement by May 2024, it is
5	set to pass the final treaty; and
6	WHEREAS, on the basis of the text of the draft Pandemic Agreement, the United
7	States and other countries that ratify it would need to commit to temporarily waive
8	intellectual property rights; and
9	WHEREAS, Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution of the United States clearly
10	states that Congress shall have power "to promote the Progress of Science and useful
11	Arts, by securing for limited Times to authors and inventors the exclusive Right to their
12	respective Writing and Discoveries" which ensures copyright holders rights to their
13	intellectual property; and
14	WHEREAS, Section 1 of the Constitution of Kentucky states that among the certain
15	and inalienable rights of men is the right of acquiring and protecting property; and
16	WHEREAS, ratification of the World Health Organization's Pandemic Agreement
17	would also encroach on the sovereignty of the United States at the expense of our laws,
18	the Constitution of Kentucky, and the Constitution of the United States; and
19	WHEREAS, the rights of our citizens granted by the Constitution will not be
20	delegated to nor imposed by any unelected foreign agency; and
21	WHEREAS, it is the intent of this honorable body to defend the Commonwealth of
22	Kentucky against violations of the Constitution of the United States and further prevent
23	subjecting the sovereignty and rights of the United States of America to any foreign
24	nation or collective;
25	NOW, THEREFORE,
26	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
27	Kentucky:
