NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

→ Section 1. The Senate hereby honors the Southern Star Missionary Baptist Church, grants all its members heartfelt praise as they continue to worship the holy spirit with the humility and grace the church has become known for in Louisville and in this great Commonwealth, and offers all the church leaders best wishes as they continue to steer the church toward a future touched by God's magnificent hands.
