| 3  | WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among              |
| 4  | men and women combined in the United States; and                                          |
| 5  | WHEREAS, in 2016, more than 130,000 Americans will be diagnosed with                      |
| 6  | colorectal cancer and approximately 50,000 Americans will die from it; and                |
| 7  | WHEREAS, approximately 60 percent of colorectal cancer cases and 70 percent of            |
| 8  | deaths occur in those aged 65 and older; and                                              |
| 9  | WHEREAS, colorectal cancer screening colonoscopy permits the detection and                |
| 10 | removal of polyps, or abnormal growths, that could become cancerous, as well as for the   |
| 11 | early detection of colorectal cancer when treatment can be most effective; and            |
| 12 | WHEREAS, although colorectal cancer is largely preventable, one in three adults           |
| 13 | between the ages of 50 and 75 are not up to date with recommended colorectal cancer       |
| 14 | screening; and                                                                            |
| 15 | WHEREAS, over 200 organizations have committed to eliminating colorectal                  |
| 16 | cancer as a major public health problem and are working toward the shared goal of         |
| 17 | reaching 80 percent screened for colorectal cancer by 2018; and                           |
| 18 | WHEREAS, colorectal cancer screening colonoscopy is a highly effective                    |
| 19 | preventive service, and removing financial barriers can help to increase screening rates; |

| 21 | WHEREAS, the Kentucky age-adjusted rate of colon cancer is 56.3 per 100,000               |
| 22 | population, which is the highest in the nation; and                                       |
| 23 | WHEREAS, Kentucky has the fifth highest mortality rate from colon cancer in the           |
| 24 | nation at 18.7 per 100,000;                                                               |
| 25 | NOW, THEREFORE,                                                                           |
| 26 | Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of               |

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Kentucky:

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Section 1. The Senate urges the United States Congress to amend Section 1833(a)(1)(Y) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 13951(a)(1)(Y)) to include coverage for a colorectal cancer screening test, regardless of the code that is billed, for the establishment of a diagnosis as a result of the test or for the removal of tissue or other procedure that is furnished in connection with, as a result of, and in the same clinical encounter as the screening test.

→ Section 2. The Clerk of the Senate shall send a copy of this Resolution to each
member of the Kentucky delegation in the Congress of the United States.
