44	(4) Protected health information as the term is defined under the federal
45	Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996.
46	(5) Information subject to attorney client privilege.
47	(6) Secure information that would reveal undercover or intelligence
48	operations by law enforcement.
49	(7) Any information that is confidential under state or federal law, rule
