RETIREMENT/STATE EMPS: Provides for benefits for certain members of the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System totally and permanently disabled in the line of duty by an intentional act of violence

DIGEST

<u>Present law</u> provides the following disability benefits for the following LASERS members who become totally and permanently disabled from an injury received in the line of duty:

- (1) Members of the Corrections Plan: 60% of average compensation (FAC), subject to appropriation of funds.
- (2) Members of the Public Safety Services Plan with less than 10 years of service: 40% of FAC. Members with 10 or more years of service: the greater of the member's regular retirement benefit calculated without reduction due to age or 40% of FAC, whichever is greater.
- (3) Members of the Wildlife Agents Plan: 60% of FAC.
- (4) Members of the Harbor Police Retirement Plan: 60% of FAC.
- (5) Members of the Hazardous Duty Services Plan: 75% of FAC.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides a disability benefit of 100% of FAC for a member of any of these plans who becomes permanently and totally disabled as a result of injuries sustained, while engaged in the discharge of his duties, as a result of an intentional act of violence.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes requirement that disability benefits payable to members of the Primary Corrections Plans are subject to the appropriation of funds.

<u>Proposed law</u> applies to any disability retiree receiving disability benefits on the effective date of <u>proposed law</u> if he is approved for the benefits provided by <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Retirement to the engrossed bill

- 1. Removes provisions related to permanent benefit increases and OGB premiums.
- 2. Specifies that for a disability retiree receiving benefits on the effective date of <u>proposed law</u> who is approved for the increase in <u>proposed law</u> the system shall charge the employing agency for any actuarial cost, to be paid within 10 years as required by <u>present constitution</u>.
- 3. Requires LASERS board to notify the legislature electronically when a benefit is granted pursuant to proposed law.
- 4. Gives the system board the duty to determine whether the injury meets the requirements of <u>proposed law</u>.
