(KEYWORD, SUMMARY, AND DIGEST as amended by Senate committee amendments)

CRIME: Creates the crime of providing false, nonexistent, or incomplete declaration of residence for bail

DIGEST

Proposed law provides that it shall be unlawful for any person knowingly to give or place on any bail bond or declaration of residence false, nonexistent, or incomplete information for purposes of service or notice.

Proposed law provides criminal penalties for misdemeanor cases including imprisonment for not more than six months, or a fine of not more than \$500, or both. For felonies, the criminal penalties include imprisonment at hard labor for not more than two years.

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice to the original bill:

1. Changes proposed penalty provisions to make them consistent with the crime of jumping bail.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the engrossed bill

1. Add knowing requirement to proposed law.
2. Delete provision from proposed law relative to presumption of false address based on officer's statement on return.
