MTR VEHICLE/DRIVER LIC OR NO IMPACT See Note
Provides relative to the issuance and possession of drivers' licenses

Present law requires persons licensed to drive motor vehicles in LA to have a license in their immediate possession at all times when driving a motor vehicle. Proposed law authorizes a licensee to have an electronic copy of their license provided by the Dept. of Public Safety & Corrections, Office of Motor Vehicles as an alternative to a physical license. Proposed law requires the department to indicate the new expiration date of a license when it is renewed by mail or electronic commerce.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

However, to the extent that proposed law may result in the department utilizing a more sophisticated system to deliver electronic credentials, a material cost increase would occur.
