Abstract: Changes the penalties for the crime of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle.

<u>Present law</u> provides that unauthorized use of a motor vehicle is the intentional taking or use of a motor vehicle which belongs to another without the intent to permanently deprive the other of the motor vehicle permanently.

<u>Present law</u> provides that an offender shall be fined not more than \$5,000, imprisoned with or without hard labor for not more than two years, or both.

<u>Proposed law</u> amends <u>present law</u> to change the penalties as follows:

- (1) First conviction, the offender shall be imprisoned for not more than six months, or may be fined not more than \$1,000, or both.
- (2) Upon two or more previous convictions, an offender who receives a subsequent conviction shall be imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not more than two years, or may be fined not more than \$2,000, or both.
