**CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES: Adds additional substances to Schedule I of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law.**

Present law provides for classification of controlled dangerous substances in Schedules I through V.

Proposed law adds substances and chemical groups to the list of Schedule I controlled dangerous substances and makes nomenclature changes to certain chemical groups in Schedule I.

Proposed law creates exceptions to the crimes of unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of prohibited and hallucinogenic plant products for dietary supplements.

Effective upon signature of governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.

(Amends R.S. 40:964(Schedule I)(F)(12) - (28); adds R.S. 40:964(Schedule I)(C)(60) - (63) and (E)(10) and (11), 989.1(F) and 989.2(F))

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

The Committee Amendments Proposed by House Committee on Administration of Criminal Justice to the original bill:

- 1. Make technical nomenclature changes to chemical groups of synthetic cannabinoids in Schedule I.

The House Floor Amendments to the engrossed bill:

- 1. Add an exception to the crimes of unlawful production, manufacturing, distribution, or possession of prohibited and hallucinogenic plant products for certain dietary supplements.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by Senate

Committee Amendments Proposed by Senate Committee on Judiciary C to the reengrossed bill

- 1. Add 1-methoxy-3,3-dimethyl-1-oxobutanyl-2yl-(1-cyclohexylmethyl)-1H-indazole-3-carboxylate to Schedule I(F) of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Law relative to synthetic cannabinoids.
