<u>Prior law</u> required foreign and alien insurers issuing workers' compensation policies in La. to either maintain a claims office in La. for processing such claims or retain the services of an independent La. domiciled claims adjuster.

<u>New law</u> changes <u>prior law</u> by repealing the requirement that the retained claims adjuster be domiciled independently.

<u>Prior law</u> provided that all insurers who issued workers' compensation policies in La. would either establish and maintain a claims office within La. or retain a licensed claims adjuster.

<u>New law</u> changes <u>prior law</u> by specifying that the retained claims adjuster shall have a La. claims adjuster license.

<u>New law</u> provides that any insurer issuing workers' compensation policies in La. shall make any relevant claims adjuster available for deposition via telephone or video conferencing if a disputed claim for compensation is filed in which liability for statutory penalties and attorneys fees is at issue. <u>New law</u> further provides that insurers shall make relevant adjusters available for in person testimony at the insurer's expense if a trial becomes necessary to adjudicate the disputed claim for compensation.
