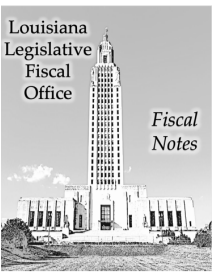

 Extends applicability of both aggravated and simple obstruction of a highway of commerce to state waters. (8/1/24)

Current law provides that aggravated obstruction of a highway of commerce is the intentional or criminally negligent placing of anything or performance of any act on any railway, railroad, navigable waterway, road, highway, thoroughfare, or runway of an airport, wherein it is foreseeable that human life might be endangered; provides that simple obstruction of a highway of commerce is the intentional or criminally negligent placing of anything or performance of any act on any railway, road, navigable waterway, road, highway, thoroughfare, or runway of an airport, which will render movement thereon more difficult. Proposed law adds waters of the state in both the crimes of aggravated obstruction of a highway of commerce and simple obstruction of a highway of commerce; becomes effective 8/01/24.

EXPENDITURE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in SGF expenditures in the Department of Public Safety & Corrections - Corrections Services, to the extent that an offender sustains a felony-grade conviction for aggravated obstruction of a highway of commerce by intentional or criminally negligent placing of anything or performance of any act on any water of the state where it is foreseeable that human life might be endangered. While the proposed law does not enhance penalties for potential offenders, it extends the area in which the current law crimes of simple and aggravated obstruction of a highway of commerce can occur.

The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation to expenditures is indeterminable, since it is not known how many people will be convicted and subsequently incarcerated for its violation, nor the length of the sentences assessed with those convictions as a result of its potential enactment. Proposed law is a relative felony, and any impact on either local or state expenditures is contingent on whether offenders sustain either misdemeanor or felony-grade convictions for its violation. For those convicted, sentenced, and then subsequently housed in a state facility, DPS&C-CS will sustain expenditures of \$107.60 per offender per day. For those convicted, sentenced, and then subsequently housed in a local facility, DPS&C-CS will sustain expenditures of \$26.39 per offender per day. DPS&C-CS advises that impacts on offender populations are anticipated to impact the number of offenders held in local facilities, and that in managing its offender population, it seeks to fill all beds in state facilities first, then assigns overflow offenders to local facilities.

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in Local Funds expenditures to local governing authorities, to the extent that offenders sustain misdemeanor convictions for simple or aggravated obstruction of a highway of commerce. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation to local governing authorities is indeterminable, since it is not known how many people will be convicted and incarcerated in local facilities, nor the length of the sentences assessed with those convictions as a result of its potential enactment. The maximum imprisonment term is no more than 15 years at the local level.

REVENUE EXPLANATION

Proposed law may result in an indeterminable increase in local revenues as a result of convictions of simple obstruction of a highway of commerce. The exact fiscal impact of the passage of this legislation on local revenue is indeterminable, as the fines that would be imposed on those convicted are optional, and the number of fines that will be imposed on offenders convicted of proposed law may vary. The potential revenue will accrue to the local governing authority.
