1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 13:392 and to enact R.S. 13:352(D), (E), and (F), and 588,
3	relative to furniture and equipment purchased or owned by the courts of appeal and
4	each judicial district court; to require the title of all furniture and equipment
5	purchased and in possession of the courts of appeal to vest in the purchasing court;
6	to require an itemized statement of furniture and equipment requested for purchase;
7	to authorize certain persons to complete the sale of furniture or equipment; to
8	authorize any judge to purchase furniture and equipment with nonpublic funds upon
9	termination of office; to provide for the disposition of the sale proceeds; and to
10	provide for related matters.
11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
12	Section 1. R.S. 13:392 is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 13:352(D), (E),
13	and (F) and 588 are hereby enacted to read as follows:
14	§352. Fees; bond premiums; equipment, supplies, and other expenses;
15	reimbursement of expenses of judges of courts of appeal
16	* * *
17	D. Title to all furniture and equipment purchased pursuant to the provisions
18	of this Section shall vest in the purchasing court.
19	E. Notwithstanding the provisions of Part XI of Chapter 1 of Title 39 of the
20	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, upon termination of office, each judge having
21	possession of equipment or furniture purchased with the fees provided in this Section
22	may purchase such property with nonpublic funds at a cost of the standard
23	depreciated value of the property. The clerk, or presiding judge, or any judge by

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1	direction of the court, is authorized to complete such sales, and the proceeds of the
2	sales are to be retained by the clerk and expended as provided for in this Section.
3	F. The provisions of this Section shall apply to all furniture and equipment
4	in the possession of the courts of appeal regardless of the date of acquisition.

6	§392. Payment of expenses
7	<u>A.</u> The presiding judge of each of the courts of appeal, or any one of the
8	judges, by the direction of the court, may draw a monthly warrant on the state for
9	one-twelfth of the amount of the annual appropriation as made by the legislature for
10	the expense of operation and maintenance of the said court.
11	B. Title to all furniture and equipment purchased pursuant to the provisions
12	of this Section shall vest in the purchasing court. Furniture and equipment shall be
13	purchased by the presiding judge, or any judge, by direction of the court in
14	accordance with purchasing policies of the Judicial Budgetary Control Board upon
15	presentation of itemized statements from judges setting forth in detail the furniture
16	and equipment desired to be purchased.
17	C. Notwithstanding the provisions of Part XI of Chapter 1 of Title 39 of the
18	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, upon termination of office, each judge having
19	possession of equipment or furniture purchased with the fees provided in this Section
20	may purchase such property with nonpublic funds at a cost of the standard
21	depreciated value of the property. The presiding judge, or any judge, by direction
22	of the court, is authorized to complete such sale and the proceeds of the sales are to
23	be retained by the court in the generated revenue account and expended as provided
24	<u>for in R.S. 13:352.</u>
25	D. The provisions of this Section shall apply to all furniture and equipment
26	in the possession of the courts of appeal regardless of the date of acquisition.

28	§588. Authority of judges to purchase furniture and equipment
29	Notwithstanding the provisions of Part XI of Chapter 1 of Title 39 of the
30	Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, upon termination of office, each judge having

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1	possession of equipment or furniture purchased by the judicial district court, may
2	purchase such property with nonpublic funds at a cost of the standard depreciated
3	value of the property. The presiding judge, or any judge, by direction of the court,
4	is authorized to complete such sale and the proceeds of the sales are to be deposited
5	in the account from which the funds were expended to purchase the furniture and
6	equipment.
