FIRE PROTECT/FIRE MARSHAL: Provides relative to the Life Safety and Property Protection Licensing Act

1 AN ACT 2 To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1664.2(B) and (D), 1664.3(2), (4), (7), (10), (13), (15), (20), 3 (26), (28), (36), (37), (39), (42), (43), (47), (49) through (52), (55), and (57), 4 1664.4(A) and (D), 1664.5(1), (4), (11), and (12), 1664.6(B)(introductory paragraph) 5 and (2), (E), (F), (G), and (H), 1664.7(B), (C)(introductory paragraph), (D), and (E), 1664.8(G), 1664.9(A) through (D), (I), and (J), 1664.10(3) and (4), 1664.11(A)(1) 6 7 and (2)(a), (B)(2) and (3), and (H), 1664.12(3), (8), and (11), 1664.14(A)(5), and 8 1664.15(A), to enact R.S. 40:1664.3(62) through (69), 1664.5(15), 1664.6(I), 9 1664.7(F), 1664.10(8), 1664.12(12), and to repeal R.S. 40:1664.3(38), relative to the 10 Life Safety and Property Protection Licensing Act; to change the phrase "fire 11 marshal" to "state fire marshal"; to make technical corrections; to provide for 12 definitions; to repeal the definition of "limited locksmith specialist"; to require a 13 licence to perform life safety and property protection contracting; to provide for 14 exemptions; to provide for an application process to obtain a firm license; to provide 15 for an application process to obtain an individual license; to establish licensing fees; 16 to provide for the powers and duties of the state fire marshal; to provide for the Life 17 Safety and Property Protection Advisory Board; to provide for prohibited acts; to 18 require the return of the lockout, installer, or programming code of a system to the 19 factory default when a contract for service is cancelled; and to provide for related 20 matters.

10	§1664.2. Purpose; administration and enforcement
11	* * *
12	B. The state fire marshal shall administer and enforce the provisions of this
13	Subpart and may issue rules and regulations which he considers necessary to such
14	administration and enforcement pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act. In
15	formulating necessary rules and regulations, the state fire marshal may use
16	recognized standards, including those of the National Fire Protection Association,
17	those recognized by federal law or regulation, those published by nationally
18	recognized standards-making organizations, those industry standards established by
19	accepted practices or trade associations, or those contained in manufacturers
20	installation manuals.

22	D. The Louisiana Life Safety and Property Protection Advisory Board shall
23	advise the state fire marshal with respect to administration and enforcement of the
24	provisions of this Subpart and shall exercise those functions specified in this Subpart.
25	§1664.3. Definitions
26	As used in this Subpart, the following terms shall have the meanings
27	specified in this Section:

1	(2) "Bank-locking specialist" means an individual licensed to certify, inspect,
2	install, integrate, sell, and service mechanical and or electric electronic locks within
3	the confines of a bank, credit union, or other financial institution.
4	* * *
5	(4) "Certify" means to attest to the proper functionality, inspection,
6	installation, integration, and service of life safety and property protection systems
7	and equipment in accordance with all applicable engineered specifications,
8	manufacturers manufacturer's specifications, submitted plans and per the inspection,
9	testing, and maintenance chapters as set forth in the applicable NFPA codes and
10	standards.
11	* * *
12	(7) "Designated agent" means an owner or a manager of an alarm contracting
13	company or single station fire alarm contracting company, a locksmithing services
14	company, or closed circuit television alarm system contracting company who has
15	been assigned the responsibility of submitting any notice required by this Subpart to
16	the <u>state</u> fire marshal.
17	* * *
18	(10) "Door hardware specialist technician" means an individual who consults
19	and provides technical advice regarding selection of mechanical locking devices and
20	consults and provides technical advice regarding selection of electrical or electronic
21	locking devices for controlled access to premises, safes, vaults, safe doors, lock
22	boxes, automatic teller machines, or other devices licensed to certify, inspect, install,
23	integrate, and service builders' hardware or architectural hardware, including but not
24	limited to stand alone electro/mechanical locks, latches, exit hardware, closures, and
25	hinges mounted onto doors intended to operate and secure the door properly.
26	* * *
27	(13) "Employee" means a person who performs services for wages or salary
28	and receives a W-2 tax form from his employer.
29	* * *

1	(15) "Fire detection and alarm systems" means those assemblies of wiring,
2	electronic transmitting devices, detection devices, and related equipment for the
3	detection of products of combustion or flammable or poisonous gases, heat and for
4	alerting occupants, including fire department personnel, of a fire emergency.
5	* * *
6	(20) "Fire protection systems and equipment" means those life safety and
7	property loss systems, whether commercial or residential, intended to protect a
8	structure's occupants or property from the risk and dangers of fire or explosion. Fire
9	protection systems and equipment include but are not limited to portable fire
10	extinguishers, fire detection and alarm systems, fire suppression systems, fire hoses,
11	kitchen hood, and duct installation and cleaning. However, the term "fire protection
12	system and equipment" shall not include a single station smoke or heat detector
13	installed in a private residence by a fire department, the state fire marshal, a public
14	agency, a volunteer association, or their designated representatives where no
15	compensation is received for such installation.

17	(26) "Fixed fire suppression systems technician" means an individual
18	licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service fixed fire suppression
19	systems and kitchen hood and duct systems.
20	* * *
21	(28) "Household fire warning system" means a fire alarm, fire alarm system,
22	or portion of such an alarm or system intended to detect or warn of smoke, poisonous
23	gases, or fire and intended for use in a residential one- or two-family dwelling or
24	wholly within the confines of an individual living unit in a residential multifamily
25	structure. Household fire warning systems are a subclassification of security.
26	* * *
27	(36) "Kitchen suppression specialist" means an individual licensed to certify,
28	inspect, install, integrate, and service pre-engineered fire suppression systems and
29	kitchen hood and duct systems protecting kitchen appliances.

(37) "Life safety and property protection contracting" means performing
certification, inspection, installation, integration, sale, or service of systems and
equipment designed to protect life and property. Life safety and property protection
systems and equipment include but is not limited to mechanical or electronic locking
locks, special locking systems and equipment, security systems and equipment, fire
sprinkler systems and equipment, fire detection and alarm systems and equipment,
fire suppression, or other fire systems and equipment. systems and equipment, and
portable fire extinguishers, fire hoses, and kitchen hood and duct systems. Life
safety and property protection contracting includes but is not limited to the sale,
lease, rent, planning with the intent to prewire, prewiring, hydrostatic testing,
maintenance, repair, testing, modification, improvement, or alteration of life safety
systems and equipment; holding oneself or one's firm out for hire to perform any
such task; or otherwise offering to perform any such task for compensation, either
directly or indirectly. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Subpart, no person
licensed under this Subpart may install primary power sources of one hundred volts
or greater when such power source is being installed to operate low voltage systems
unless licensed by the State Licensing Board for Contractors to perform such
installations.

(39) "Locksmith technician" means an individual who sells, repairs, rebuilds, recodes, services, adjusts, installs, manipulates, or bypasses a special locking system, mechanical locking device or electrical electronic locking devices for controlled access or egress to premises, safes, vaults, safe doors, lock boxes, automatic teller machines, or other devices for safeguarding areas or certifies, inspects, installs, integrates, sells and services closed circuit televison alarm systems.

(42) "Officer" means the president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, comptroller, or any other person who performs functions for an alarm contracting company or single station fire alarm contracting company, a locksmithing services company or closed circuit television alarm system contracting company a life safety

and property protection contracting firm corresponding to those performed by those officers.

(43) "Operating location" means a physical address that houses an entity that performs life safety and property protection contracting. <u>All business records</u> including but not limited to payroll records, sales invoices, inspection reports, and service records shall be maintained at the operating location. The operating location shall be open during normal business hours for the inspection of records. The use of a storage facility, telephone answering service, or post office box shall not constitute a location for purposes of this Subpart.

(47) "Pre-engineered fire suppression specialist" means an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service pre-engineered fire suppression systems and kitchen hood and duct systems.

* * *

(49) "Principal" means a person or entity that owns at least five percent of a life safety and property protection contracting firm regardless of the form of organization. "Principal" includes a person or entity entitled to exercise the prerogatives or indicia of ownership or control of a life safety and property protection contracting firm whether by direct action, assignment, or any other kind of substitution or subrogation, to the extent that such person or entity would be entitled to receive at least five percent of the remaining assets of the life safety and property protection contracting firm upon dissolution. "Principal" includes, if the entity is a partnership, each partner, including any general or limited partner. "Principal" includes, if the entity is organized as a corporation, any person or entity who owns or controls five percent or more of the total aggregate number of shares of all types of stock issued by a life safety and property protection contracting firm organized as a corporation or shares of a corporation that owns or controls a life safety and property protection contracting firm. "Principal" includes any member if the entity is organized as a limited liability company has a controlling interest of

2	"Principal" includes a person or entity entitled to exercise the prerogatives or indicia

5	(50) "Property protection systems and equipment" means those life safety				
6	and property protection systems intended to protect lives and property from the risk				
7	of theft, unauthorized entry, or other physical harm to a structure's occupants or				
8	property. Security Property protection systems and equipment include, but are not				
9	limited to intrusion alarms, closed circuit television, mechanical locks, and electronic				
10	locks.				
11	(51) "Qualifier" means a person who possesses the appropriate training or				
12	experience credentials enabling a firm to obtain a life safety and property protection				
13	license. A qualifier must shall be a paid employee of the firm for which he qualifies				
14	and work a minimum of thirty-two hours per week. A qualifier must provide direct				
15	supervision of a firm's operations shall be actively involved in overseeing the life				
16	safety and property protection contracting for the firm for which he qualifies. An				
17	individual may only qualify one firm.				
18	(52) "Security sales technician specialist" means an individual licensed to				
19	sell or specify security systems and equipment.				
20	* * *				
21	(55) "Sell" means to solicit another on behalf of a property protection firm				
22	by any means, including but not limited to telephone or electronic device, public				
23	notice or advertisement, door-to-door or any other type of personal interaction. The				
24	term includes designing property protection systems.				
25	* * *				
26	(57) "Specialist" means an individual who is trained and certified to perform				
27	life safety and property protection contracting within a specific <u>limited</u> endorsement.				
28	* * *				

a life safety and property protection firm regardless of the form of organization.

(62) "Bank-locking system" means locking systems and equipment within
a financial institution. The term includes but is not limited to safes, vaults, time
locks, safety deposit box locks, combination and electronic locks, key operated
locks, teller under counter equipment, master key systems, interchangeable cores
cash dispensers, drive-up systems, money tubes, and other commercial bank
furnishings. The scope of work includes selling, installing, and servicing these
systems and equipment. Bank-locking systems are a subclassification of locksmith
The term does not include special locking or security systems and equipment as
defined in this Subpart.
(63) "Builders' hardware" or " architectural hardware" or "door hardware"
means stand alone electro/mechanical locks, latches, exit hardware, closures, and
hinges mounted onto doors intended to operate and secure the door properly. The
term does not include special locking systems.
(64) "Detention locking system" means locking systems and equipment
within a penal institution. The term includes but is not limited to doors, frames, high
security locking, and commercial locking systems. The term also includes locks of
various types including pin tumbler-standard and mogul types, lever and wafer
tumbler mechanical locks, electromechanical, full electronic, and pneumatic
controlled locks. Detention locking systems are a subclassification of locksmith. The
term does not include special locking, security, or closed circuit television alarm
systems and equipment as defined in this Subpart.
(65) "Kitchen hood and duct cleaning specialist" means an individua
licensed to clean ventilation systems covering commercial kitchen appliances.
(66) "Kitchen hood and duct specialist" means an individual licensed to
certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service ventilation systems covering
commercial kitchen appliances.
(67) "Kitchen hood and duct system" means a system of devices and
passageways over a kitchen appliance which is designed to capture, direct, and

3	(68) "Special locking specialist" means an individual who certifies, design,		
4	inspects, installs, integrates, sells, or services a special locking system protecting a		
5	controlled access area or egress to premises.		
6	(69) "State fire marshal" means the Department of Public Safety, office of		
7	state fire marshal and its authorized representatives empowered to enforce the		
8	provisions of this Subpart.		
9	§1664.4. License required		
10	A. No person or firm shall engage in life safety and property protection		
11	contracting without holding a current and valid license issued by the state fire		
12	marshal as provided in this Subpart. Life safety and property protection contracting		
13	is divided into the three main categories of fire sprinkler, fire protection, and		
14	security. Each operating location of a firm shall hold a separate firm license.		
15	* * *		
16	D. Each person who acts as an apprentice performing life safety and property		
17	protection contracting must shall apply to the state fire marshal for an apprentice		
18	license. The state fire marshal shall establish the qualifications of an apprentice by		
19	rule. An apprentice may perform such services only under the direct supervision of		
20	a technician holding a valid license pursuant to this Subpart who works for the same		
21	firm as the apprentice.		
22	§1664.5. Exemptions to licensure		
23	The requirements for licensure shall not apply to:		
24	(1) An officer or employee of the United States, this state, or any political		
25	subdivision of either, while engaged in the performance of his official duties within		
26	the course and scope of his employment with the United States, this state, or any		
27	political subdivision of either. However, no person or entity excepted from licensure		
28	pursuant to this Subpart shall engage in the certification, inspection, installation,		
29	integration, sale, or service of electronic special locking, fire detection and alarm,		

ventilate grease-laden vapors and exhaust gases. Kitchen hood and duct systems are

1	fire sprinkler, fire suppression systems, kitchen hood and duct systems or equipment,
2	or portable fire extinguishers and fire hoses.
3	* * *
4	(4) A member of the building trades general contractor licensed by the State
5	Licensing Board for Contractors and his direct employees or a building owner and
6	his direct employees performing the installation or removal of complete mechanical
7	locks or locking devices lock sets when doing so in the course of residential or
8	commercial new construction or remodeling.
9	* * *
10	(11) Any gate manufacturer or merchant that is in the business of installing,
11	servicing, repairing, rebuilding, reprogramming, or maintaining electronic garage
12	door devices or gate systems for vehicle traffic. This exception from licensure shall
13	also apply to the employees of the manufacturer or merchant but only as to work
14	performed by them on behalf of the exempted employer.
15	(12) A firm or person licensed to perform electrical work by the State
16	Licensing Board for Contractors pursuant to R.S. 37:2156.1 and 2156.2 which
17	installs wire, conduit, or other wire raceways, its associated boxes or fittings, or
18	installs fire alarm initiating and notification devices or intrusion alarm systems or
19	closed circuit television systems or special locking systems in either commercial or
20	residential property. This exception from licensure shall also apply to the employees
21	of a firm or person exempted by this Subpart, but only as to work performed by them
22	on behalf of the exempted employer.

24	(15) A mechanical contractor, licensed by the State Licensing Board for
25	Contractors and holding a statewide mechanical work license classification issued
26	by that board, who only installs hoods or ducts within a kitchen ventilation system.
27	§1664.6. Application for a firm license; requirements to maintain

1	B. An applicant for a firm license shall submit the following to the <u>state</u> fire
2	marshal:
3	* * *
4	(2) Documentation that the firm is an entity duly authorized to conduct
5	business within this state. If the firm is physically located in Louisiana,
6	documentation shall be in the form of a local or parish occupational license and if
7	incorporated, registration with the secretary of state. If the firm is physically located
8	outside of the state, documentation shall be in the form of registration with the
9	secretary of state as a foreign corporation including the name of the firm's registered
10	agent of service.
11	* * *
12	E. Each firm as a condition of licensure shall be open for inspection by the
13	state fire marshal or his designated representative at any reasonable time for the
14	purpose of observation and collection of facts and data relating to proper
15	enforcement of this Subpart. No person acting on behalf of the firm shall refuse to
16	admit the state fire marshal or his designated representative to an operating location.
17	Firms physically located outside of Louisiana may be charged for the travel expenses
18	of the state fire marshal to conduct such an inspection.
19	F. As a further condition of licensure, the acceptance of a license by a firm
20	shall be deemed as consent to submit to the reasonable requests for documentation
21	by the office of the state fire marshal or his designated representatives and to
22	cooperate in a lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal. Refusal to
23	cooperate with any lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal shall
24	be subject to any penalty as outlined in this Section, including suspension or
25	revocation of license.
26	G. Each firm shall clearly display its license in a conspicuous location at its
27	place of business.

1	G. H. The designated agent of a life safety and property protection firm shall
2	notify the fire marshal within ten days of the following:

6	§1664.7. Application for an individual license; requirements to maintain

8	B. As a further condition of licensure, the acceptance of a license by a firm
9	shall be deemed as consent to submit to the reasonable requests for documentation
10	by the office of the state fire marshal or his designated representatives and to
11	cooperate in a lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal. Refusal to
12	cooperate with any lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal shall
13	be subject to any penalty as outlined in this Section, including suspension or
14	revocation of license.
15	C. Each individual license holder shall notify the state fire marshal, on a
16	form specified and provided by the state fire marshal, within ten days of the
17	following:

19	C. D. No individual licensed under this Section shall contract for his services
20	as an independent contractor or agent with any life safety and property protection
21	firm or with any other license holder under this Section.
22	D. <u>E.</u> Meet all certification, continuing education, training, and testing
23	requirements as established by the board.
24	E. F. An individual may act as a temporary apprentice for a thirty-day
25	calendar period commencing on the date the fire marshal receives an application
26	from the applicant. Applications for property protection endorsements must shall be
27	accompanied by a criminal record check of the applicant. Such license shall expire
28	on the thirtieth calendar day after its commencement or on the date of issuance of an
29	apprentice or technician license, whichever is earlier.

§1664.8. Criminal background checks

G. The <u>state</u> fire marshal is authorized to order fingerprint analysis or any other analysis or documents deemed necessary by the <u>state</u> fire marshal for the purpose of verifying the criminal history of a person or named officer or principal of a firm applying for a license. The <u>state</u> fire marshal shall have the authority to conduct criminal history verification on a local, state, or national level. All costs for verifying criminal history shall be borne by the applicant.

§1664.9. Fees; Louisiana Life Safety and Property Protection Trust Fund

A. The fire marshal is authorized to assess and collect fees pursuant to this Subpart. License endorsements are separated into the two general categories of Property Protection and Life Safety. The Property Protection category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Locksmith, Special Locking Door Hardware, and Security. The Life Safety category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Fire Sprinkler, Fire Suppression, Fire Alarm, Fire Other Portable Fire Extinguishers and Hoses, and DOT Hydrostatic Testing. Technical endorsements may further be divided into specialty endorsements. A technical endorsement holder is authorized to perform all life safety and property protection contracting authorized by the specialty endorsement within the specific technical endorsement category. Specialty endorsement holders are limited to only life safety and property protection contracting authorized by that specialty endorsement.

Arnold HB No. 1053

Abstract: Makes changes to the Life Safety and Property Protection Licensing Act.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes technical corrections.

Proposed law change the phrase "fire marshal" to "state fire marshal".

<u>Present law</u> defines "bank-locking specialist" as an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, sell, and service mechanical or electric locks within the confines of a bank, credit union, or other financial institution.

Proposed law retains present law but changes "electric locks" to "electronic locks".

<u>Present law</u> defines "door hardware specialist" as an individual who consults and provides technical advice regarding selection of mechanical locking devices and consults and provides technical advice regarding selection of electrical or electronic locking devices for controlled access to premises, safes, vaults, safe doors, lock boxes, automatic teller machines, or other devices.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes "door hardware specialist" to "door hardware <u>technician</u>" and defines it as an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service builders' hardware or architectural hardware, including but not limited to stand alone electro/mechanical locks, latches, exit hardware, closures, and hinges mounted onto doors intended to operate and secure the door properly.

<u>Present law</u> defines "employee" as a person who performs services for wages or salary.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds the requirement that the person receive a W-2 tax form from his employer.

<u>Present law</u> defines "fire detection and alarm systems" as those assemblies of wiring, electronic transmitting devices, detection devices, and related equipment for the detection

of products of combustion or flammable gases, heat and for alerting occupants, including fire department personnel, of a fire emergency.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but adds that fire detection and alarm systems are also used for the detection of <u>poisonous</u> gases.

<u>Present law</u> defines "fixed fire suppression systems technician" as an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service fixed fire suppression systems.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service kitchen hood and duct systems.

<u>Present law</u> defines "household fire warning system" as a fire alarm, fire alarm system, or portion of such an alarm or system intended to detect or warn of smoke, or fire and intended for use in a residential one- or two-family dwelling or wholly within the confines of an individual living unit in a residential multifamily structure.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but adds that household fire warning systems are also used for the detection of <u>poisonous</u> gases.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that household fire warning systems are a subclassification of security.

<u>Present law</u> defines "kitchen suppression specialist" as an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service pre-engineered fire suppression systems protecting kitchen appliances.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service kitchen hood and duct systems.

<u>Present law</u> defines "life safety and property protection contracting" as performing certification, inspection, installation, integration, sale, or service of mechanical locking, special locking, fire sprinkler, fire alarm, fire suppression, or other fire systems and equipment.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "life safety and property protection contracting" as performing certification, inspection, installation, integration, sale, or service of systems and equipment designed to protect life and property. Life safety and property protection systems and equipment include but is not limited to mechanical or electronic locks, special locking systems and equipment, security systems and equipment, fire sprinkler systems and equipment, fire detection and alarm systems and equipment, fire suppression systems and equipment, and portable fire extinguishers, fire hoses, and kitchen hood and duct systems.

<u>Present law</u> defines "locksmith technician" as an individual who sells, repairs, rebuilds, recodes, services, adjusts, installs, manipulates, or bypasses a special locking system, mechanical locking device or electrical locking devices for controlled access or egress to premises, safes, vaults, safe doors, lock boxes, automatic teller machines, or other devices for safeguarding areas or certifies, inspects, installs, integrates, sells and services closed circuit televison alarm systems.

Proposed law retains present law but changes "electrical locking" to "electronic locking".

<u>Present law</u> defines "officer" as the president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, comptroller, or any other person who performs functions for an alarm contracting company or single station fire alarm contracting company, a locksmithing services company or closed circuit television alarm system contracting company corresponding to those performed by those officers.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "officer" as the president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, comptroller, or any other person who performs functions for a life safety and property protection contracting firm corresponding to those performed by those officers.

<u>Present law</u> defines "operating location" as a physical address that houses an entity that performs life safety and property protection contracting.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires all business records including but not limited to payroll records, sales invoices, inspection reports, and service records to be maintained at the operating location.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the operating location to be open during normal business hours for the inspection of records.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the use of a storage facility, telephone answering service, or post office box shall not constitute a location for purposes of this <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> defines "pre-engineered fire suppression specialist" means an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service pre-engineered fire suppression systems.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands <u>present law</u> to include an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service kitchen hood and duct systems.

Present law defines "principal" as a person or entity that owns at least 5% of a life safety and property protection contracting firm regardless of the form of organization. "Principal" includes a person or entity entitled to exercise the prerogatives or indicia of ownership or control of a life safety and property protection contracting firm whether by direct action, assignment, or any other kind of substitution or subrogation, to the extent that such person or entity would be entitled to receive at least 5% of the remaining assets of the life safety and property protection contracting firm upon dissolution. "Principal" includes, if the entity is a partnership, each partner, including any general or limited partner. "Principal" includes, if the entity is organized as a corporation, any person or entity who owns or controls 5% or more of the total aggregate number of shares of all types of stock issued by a life safety and property protection contracting firm organized as a corporation or shares of a corporation that owns or controls a life safety and property protection contracting firm. "Principal" includes any member if the entity is organized as a limited liability company.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "principal" as a person or entity that has a controlling interest of a life safety and property protection firm regardless of the form of organization. "Principal" includes a person or entity entitled to exercise the prerogatives or indicia of ownership or control of a property protection firm whether by direct action, assignment, or any other kind of substitution or subrogation.

<u>Present law</u> defines "qualifier" as a person who possesses the appropriate training or experience credentials enabling a firm to obtain a life safety and property protection license.

<u>Present law</u> requires that a qualifier must provide direct supervision of a firm's operations for which he qualifies.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires that a qualifier shall be actively involved in overseeing the life safety and property protection contracting for the firm for which he qualifies.

<u>Present law</u> defines "security sales technician" as an individual licensed to sell or specify security systems and equipment.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes "security sales technician" to "security sales <u>specialist</u>".

<u>Present law</u> defines "sell" as to solicit another on behalf of a property protection firm by any means, including but not limited to telephone or electronic device, public notice or advertisement, door-to-door or any other type of personal interaction.

<u>Proposed law</u> expands the definition of "sell" to include designing property protection systems.

<u>Present law</u> defines "specialist" as an individual who is trained and certified to perform life safety and property protection contracting within a specific endorsement.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but specifies that the endorsement is a limited endorsement.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "bank-locking system" as locking systems and equipment within a financial institution. The term includes but is not limited to safes, vaults, time locks, safety deposit box locks, combination and electronic locks, key operated locks, teller under counter equipment, master key systems, interchangeable cores, cash dispensers, drive-up systems, money tubes, and other commercial bank furnishings. The scope of work includes selling, installing, and servicing these systems and equipment. The term does not include special locking or security systems and equipment.

Proposed law provides that bank-locking systems are a subclassification of locksmith.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "builders' hardware" or "architectural hardware" or "door hardware" as stand alone electro/mechanical locks, latches, exit hardware, closures, and hinges mounted onto doors intended to operate and secure the door properly. The term does not include special locking systems.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "detention locking system" as locking systems and equipment within a penal institution. The term includes but is not limited to doors, frames, high security locking, and commercial locking systems. The term also includes locks of various types including pin tumbler-standard and mogul types, lever and wafer tumbler mechanical locks, electromechanical, full electronic, and pneumatic controlled locks. The term does not include special locking, security, or closed circuit television alarm systems and equipment.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that detention locking systems are a subclassification of locksmith.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "kitchen hood and duct cleaning specialist" as an individual licensed to clean ventilation systems covering commercial kitchen appliances.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "kitchen hood and duct specialist" as an individual licensed to certify, inspect, install, integrate, and service ventilation systems covering commercial kitchen appliances.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "kitchen hood and duct system" as a system of devices and passageways over a kitchen appliance which is designed to capture, direct, and ventilate grease-laden vapors and exhaust gases.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that kitchen hood and duct systems are a subclassification of fire suppression.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines "special locking specialist" as an individual who certifies, design, inspects, installs, integrates, sells, or services a special locking system protecting a controlled access area or egress to premises.

<u>Proposed law</u> defines"state fire marshal" as the Department of Public Safety, office of state fire marshal and its authorized representatives.

<u>Present law</u> defines "limited locksmith specialist" as an individual who sells, repairs, rebuilds, recodes, services, adjusts, installs, manipulates, or bypasses a mechanical locking device for safeguarding areas. The term does not include special locking systems or closed circuit televison alarm systems.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> provides that life safety and property protection contracting is divided into the three main categories of fire sprinkler, fire protection, and security.

Proposed law repeals present law.

<u>Present law</u> exempts, from the license requirement, an officer or employee of the United States, this state, or any political subdivision of either, while engaged in the performance of his official duties within the course and scope of his employment with the United States, this state, or any political subdivision of either.

<u>Present law</u> provides that no person or entity excepted from licensure shall engage in the certification, inspection, installation, integration, sale, or service of electronic locking, fire detection and alarm, fire sprinkler, fire suppression systems, or portable fire extinguishers.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes "electronic locking" to "special locking" and adds that no person or entity excepted from licensure shall engage in the certification, inspection, installation, integration, sale, or service of kitchen hood and duct systems or equipment or fire hoses.

<u>Present law</u> exempts from licensure a member of the building trades or building owner performing the installation or removal of complete locks or locking devices when doing so in the course of residential or commercial new construction or remodeling.

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts a general contractor licensed by the State Licensing Board for Contractors and his direct employees or a building owner and his direct employees performing the installation or removal of complete mechanical lock sets when doing so in the course of residential or commercial new construction or remodeling.

<u>Present law</u> exempts from licensure any gate manufacturer or merchant that is in the business of installing, servicing, repairing, rebuilding, reprogramming, or maintaining electronic garage door devices or gate systems for vehicle traffic.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the exemption for any gate manufacturer or merchant that is in the business of installing, servicing, repairing, rebuilding, reprogramming, or maintaining gate systems for vehicle traffic.

<u>Present law</u> exempts from licensure a firm or person licensed to perform electrical work by the State Licensing Board for Contractors which installs wire, conduit, or other wire raceways, its associated boxes or fittings, or installs fire alarm initiating and notification devices or intrusion alarm systems or closed circuit television systems or special locking systems in either commercial or residential property.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes exemption for a firm or person licensed to perform electrical work by the State Licensing Board for Contractors which installs intrusion alarm systems or closed circuit television systems or special locking systems in either commercial or residential property.

<u>Proposed law</u> exempts from licensure a mechanical contractor, licensed by the State Licensing Board for Contractors and holding a statewide mechanical work license classification issued by that board, who only installs hoods or ducts within a kitchen ventilation system.

<u>Present law</u> requires an applicant for a firm license to submit documentation to the fire marshal that the firm is an entity duly authorized to conduct business within this state. If the firm is physically located outside of the state, documentation shall be in the form of registration with the secretary of state as a foreign corporation.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but also requires the documentation to include the name of the firm's registered agent of service.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that, as a further condition of licensure, the acceptance of a license by a firm shall be deemed as consent to submit to the reasonable requests for documentation by the office of the state fire marshal or his designated representatives and to cooperate in a lawful investigation by the state fire marshal.

<u>Proposed law</u> further provides that refusal to cooperate with any lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal shall be subject to any penalty as outlined in <u>proposed law</u>, including suspension or revocation of license.

<u>Present law</u> provides that license endorsements are separated into the two general categories of Property Protection and Life Safety.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Property Protection category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Locksmith, Special Locking, and Security.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the Property Protection category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Locksmith, Door Hardware, and Security.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the Life Safety category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Fire Sprinkler, Fire Suppression, Fire Alarm, Fire Other, and DOT Hydrostatic Testing.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the Life Safety category is subdivided into the Technical Endorsements of Fire Sprinkler, Fire Suppression, Fire Alarm, Portable Fire Extinguishers and Hoses, and DOT Hydrostatic Testing.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the monies in the Louisiana Life Safety and Property Protection Trust Fund shall be used solely for implementation, administration, and enforcement of <u>present law</u> and only in the amounts appropriated each year by the legislature.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but expands it to provide that the monies shall be used, for fire education or emergency response by the state fire marshal.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the state fire marshal shall conduct examinations to ascertain the qualifications and fitness of applicants for a license.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the state fire marshal shall have authority to conduct examinations to ascertain the qualifications and fitness of applicants for a license.

<u>Present law</u> provides that the state fire marshal shall issue licenses to firms and persons that meet the qualifications established by <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the state fire marshal shall issue full or provisional licenses to firms and persons that meet the qualifications.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that the state fire marshal shall investigate all written complaints lodged against firms or individuals who are alleged to have violated <u>proposed law</u> and pursue administrative action against the firms or individuals.

Present law creates the Life Safety and Property Protection Advisory Board.

Present law provides that the board shall be composed of 12 members, as follows:

- (1) Eleven members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of nominees submitted to the governor by the fire marshal.
- One member shall be an employee of the office of the state fire marshal designated by the state fire marshal.

Proposed law provides that the board shall be composed of 13 members, as follows:

(1) Twelve members shall be appointed by the governor from a list of nominees submitted to the governor by the Louisiana Life Safety and Security Association, the Louisiana Fire Sprinkler Association, and the Louisiana Automatic Fire Alarm Association.

One member shall be an employee of the office of the state fire marshal designated by the state fire marshal.

<u>Present law</u> requires that the board shall consist of members representing all aspects of life safety and property protection. Each of the technical endorsements shall be represented by at least one board member licensed for such.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds the restriction that members who only have a specialty endorsement may be appointed if all the technical endorsements have representation.

<u>Present law</u> provides that any person appointed to the board shall be licensed pursuant to <u>present law</u> and shall have been engaged in life safety and property protection contracting for a minimum of four years prior to his appointment, except that one member may be from an associate industry to life safety and property protection or end user for which no license is required.

<u>Proposed law retains present law</u> but increases the permissible number of associate industry members <u>to</u> two and requires the members to be legally registered to do business in Louisiana.

Present law establishes prohibited acts for licensed individuals and firms.

<u>Proposed law</u> prohibits a licensed individual from refusing to cooperate with any lawful investigation by the office of the state fire marshal.

<u>Present law</u> requires each firm engaged in life safety and property protection contracting who sells a life safety or property protection system to a consumer to immediately return the lockout, installer, or programming code of the system to the factory default setting when the consumer cancels the contract with the firm and contracts with another firm provided all original contractual obligations are fulfilled.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but changes the requirement that the system be returned to the factory default setting immediately <u>to</u> within five business days following notification and removes the requirement that the consumer contracts with another firm.
