1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:327(A)(2) and to enact R.S. 14:34.8, relative to crimes
3	involving certain medical personnel; to create the crime of battery of emergency
4	room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional; to
5	provide for criminal penalties; to provide for definitions; to amend the crime of
6	obstructing a fireman to include certain emergency services personnel; and to
7	provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 14:327(A)(2) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 14:34.8 is
10	hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	<u>§34.8.</u> Battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a
12	healthcare professional
13	A.(1) Battery of emergency room personnel, emergency services personnel,
14	or a healthcare professional is battery committed without the consent of the victim
15	when the offender has reasonable grounds to believe that the victim is emergency
16	room personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional acting
17	in the performance of his employment duties.
18	(2) The use of force of violence upon the person of emergency room
19	personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional by throwing
20	feces, urine, blood, saliva, or any form of human waste by an offender while the
21	offender is transported to or from a medical facility or while being evaluated or
22	treated in a medical facility shall also constitute battery of emergency room
23	personnel, emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional.

1	B. For purposes of this Section:
2	(1) "Emergency room personnel" includes a person in a hospital emergency
3	department who, in the course and scope of his employment or as a volunteer,
4	provides services or medical care, or who assists in the providing of services or
5	medical care, for the benefit of the general public during emergency situations.
6	"Emergency room personnel" shall include but not be limited to any healthcare
7	professional, emergency department clerk, emergency department technician,
8	student, and emergency department volunteer working in the hospital emergency
9	department.
10	(2) "Emergency services personnel" means any "emergency medical services
11	personnel" as defined by R.S. 40:1300.103 or any "EMS practitioners" as defined by
12	<u>R.S. 40:1231.</u>
13	(3) "Healthcare professional" means a person licensed or certified by this
14	state to provide healthcare or professional services as a physician, physician
15	assistant, dentist, registered or licensed practical nurse or certified nurse assistant,
16	advanced practice registered nurse, certified emergency medical technician,
17	paramedic, certified registered nurse anesthetist, nurse practitioner, respiratory
18	therapist, clinical nurse specialist, pharmacist, optometrist, podiatrist, chiropractor,
19	physical therapist, occupational therapist, licensed radiologic technologist, licensed
20	clinical laboratory scientist, licensed professional counselor, certified social worker,
21	or psychologist.
22	C.(1) Whoever commits the crime of battery of emergency room personnel,
23	emergency services personnel, or a healthcare professional shall be fined not more
24	than one thousand dollars and imprisoned for not less than fifteen days nor more than
25	six months. At least forty-eight hours of the sentence imposed shall be without
26	benefit of suspension of sentence.
27	(2) If the battery produces an injury that requires medical attention, the
28	offender shall be fined not more than five thousand dollars and imprisoned with or

1	without hard labor for not less than one year nor more than five years. At least five
2	days of the sentence imposed shall be without benefit of suspension of sentence.

7	(2) For the purposes of this Section, "fireman" shall include certified first
8	responders as defined in R.S. 40:1231(9), certified emergency medical technicians
9	as defined in R.S. 40:1231(5) all persons defined as "emergency medical services
10	personnel" by R.S. 40:1300.103, all persons defined as "emergency medical services
11	personnel" by R.S. 40:1231, and any firefighter regularly employed by a fire
12	department of any municipality, parish, or fire protection district of the state of
13	Louisiana, or any volunteer fireman of the state of Louisiana.
