STUDENTS: Provides relative to public school policies prohibiting the harassment, intimidation, and bullying of a student by another student

Abstract: Relative to public school policies prohibiting harassment, intimidation, and bullying of students by students, further defines such terms as including intimidating, threatening, or abusive gestures or written, verbal, or physical acts motivated by actual or perceived characteristics including race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, physical characteristic, political persuasion, mental disability, and physical disability as well as attire or association with others identified by such categories.

<u>Present law</u> (R.S. 17:416.13(B)) requires each city, parish, and other local public school board to adopt and incorporate into its student code of conduct a policy prohibiting the harassment, intimidation, and bullying of a student by another student. Provides that any

student, school employee, or school volunteer who in good faith reports such an incident to the appropriate school official in accordance with the procedures established by school board policy shall be immune from a right of action for damages arising from any failure to remedy the reported incident. Excepts the parishes of Livingston, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, West Feliciana, St. Helena, and Tangipahoa. Defines the terms "harassment", "intimidation", and "bullying" as any intentional gesture or written, verbal, or physical act that:

- (1) A reasonable person under the circumstances should know will have the effect of harming a student or damaging his property or placing a student in reasonable fear of harm to his life or person or damage to his property; and
- (2) Is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for a student.

<u>Proposed law</u> (R.S. 17:416.13(B)) retains <u>present law</u> except to delete the exception for the six specified parishes. Also further defines the terms "harassment", "intimidation", and "bullying" to include any intimidating, threatening, or abusive gesture or written, verbal, or physical act by a student directed at another student occurring on school property, on a school bus, or at a school-sponsored event that a reasonable person under the circumstances would perceive as being motivated by any actual or perceived characteristic such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, gender identity or expression, physical characteristic, political persuasion, mental disability, and physical disability, as well as attire or association with others identified by such categories.

Summary of Amendments Adopted by House

Committee Amendments Proposed by <u>House Committee on Education</u> to the <u>original</u> bill.

1. Changes <u>proposed law</u> definition of the terms "harassment", "intimidation", and "bullying" to refer to an intimidating, threatening, or abusive gesture or written, verbal, or physical act that a reasonable person under the circumstances would perceive as being motivated by a characteristic rather than to a gesture or written, verbal, or physical act that is reasonably perceived as being motivated by a characteristic.
