DISTRICT ATTORNEYS: Authorizes the district attorney to convene a multidisciplinary team in cases of prenatal addiction

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 40:1094, relative to pregnant women; to provide for the convening of a
3	multidisciplinary team by a district attorney regarding the disposition of cases
4	involving pregnant women who are abusing or addicted to alcohol or controlled
5	dangerous substances; to provide for the makeup of the multidisciplinary team; to
6	provide for definitions; and to provide for related matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 40:1094 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
9	<u>§1094.</u> Prenatal addiction; district attorney multidisciplinary team
10	A. A district attorney may convene a multidisciplinary team to assist in
11	making a determination of the appropriate disposition of a case where a pregnant
12	woman is abusing or is addicted to controlled dangerous substances or alcohol to the
13	extent that the unborn child is at risk of harm.
14	B. The multidisciplinary team shall include at least one person with training
15	and experience in the treatment of addiction.
16	C. As used in this Section, "appropriate disposition" may include but shall
17	not be limited to filing a petition for involuntary commitment as provided for in R.S.
18	28:53 and 53.2 to a public facility or a private facility willing to accept the pregnant
19	woman for treatment.

Abstract: Authorizes the district attorney to convene a multidisciplinary team regarding cases of pregnant women who are abusing alcohol and drugs.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that a district attorney may convene a multidisciplinary team to assist in making a determination of the appropriate disposition of a case where a pregnant woman is abusing or is addicted to controlled dangerous substances or alcohol to the extent that the unborn child is at risk of harm. Requires at least one member of the team to have training and experience in the treatment of addiction.

Proposed law defines "appropriate disposition".
