1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 29:739, relative to intrastate mutual aid; to provide for the creation and
3	implementation of an Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact; to provide for an Intrastate
4	Mutual Aid Subcommittee; to provide for guidelines and procedures; to define
5	certain terms; to provide for responsibilities of parishes; to provide for license,
6	certificate, and permit portability; to provide for parish reimbursement; to provide
7	relative to workers' compensation; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 29:739 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	<u>§739. Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact</u>
11	A. Declaration of Intent; purpose
12	This state enacts into law the Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact, which is hereby
13	established. The compact is and shall hereafter be in effect for any and all parishes
14	in this state. The Intrastate Mutual Aid Compact is a system of intrastate mutual aid
15	between parishes in the state, to provide and promote mutual assistance among the
16	parishes in the prevention of, response to, and recovery from, an emergency or
17	disaster, as defined in R.S. 29:723, occurring in a parish, or any other event that
18	exceeds a parish's capability or resources. The system shall also provide for mutual
19	cooperation among the parishes in conducting disaster related exercises, testing, or
20	other training activities outside actual emergency periods. This legislation does not
21	mandate that a parish provide assistance when requested, nor does it preclude
22	parishes from entering into supplemental agreements with other parishes pursuant
23	to R.S. 29:730 and 730.1 and does not affect any other agreement to which a parish
24	may currently be a party, or decide to be a party.

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1	B. Immunity
2	The provisions of R.S. 29:735 shall apply to personnel responding to requests
3	for assistance under this Act.
4	C. Definitions
5	As used in this Section, "first responder" refers to those individuals who in
6	the early stages of an incident are responsible for the protection and preservation of
7	life, property, evidence, and the environment, including emergency response
8	providers as defined in Section 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
9	101), as well as emergency management, public health, clinical care, public works,
10	and other skilled support personnel, such as equipment operators that provide
11	immediate support services during prevention, response, and recovery operations
12	consistent with Homeland Security Presidential Directive 8.
13	D. Establishment of an Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee
14	(1) An Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee is hereby established and shall
15	be composed of the following members:
16	(a) President of the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association, Inc., or his designee.
17	(b) President of the Louisiana Association of Chiefs of Police, Inc., or his
18	designee.
19	(c) President of the Louisiana Fire Chiefs Association, or his designee.
20	(d) Chair of the Regional Parish Homeland Security and Emergency
21	Preparedness Directors Committee, or his designee.
22	(e) State fire marshal, or his designee.
23	(f) The deputy secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections,
24	public safety services, or his designee.
25	(g) The director of the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and
26	Emergency Preparedness, or his designee.
27	(h) The president of the Police Jury Association of Louisiana, or his
28	designee.
29	(i) The president of the Louisiana Municipal Association, or his designee.

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1	(2) The chairman of the subcommittee shall be appointed by the director of
2	the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness. All
3	remaining officers shall be elected by and from the membership of the
4	subcommittee.
5	(3) Members of the subcommittee shall be entitled to be reimbursed for
6	actual expenses for travel consistent with allowances for state classified employees
7	approved by the chairman of the subcommittee, if funding is available.
8	(4) The subcommittee shall meet at regular intervals at the direction of the
9	chairman.
10	(5) It shall be the subcommittee's responsibility to do the following:
11	(a) Review the progress and status of providing statewide mutual aid in times
12	of disaster.
13	(b) Assist in developing methods to track and evaluate the activation of the
14	mutual aid system.
15	(c) Examine issues facing participating parishes regarding the
16	implementation of this compact.
17	(6) The subcommittee shall prepare an annual report on the condition and
18	effectiveness of mutual aid in the state, make recommendations for correcting any
19	deficiencies, and submit that report to the governor and the Joint House and Senate
20	Select Committees on Homeland Security.
21	(7) The subcommittee shall make recommendations to the Governor's Office
22	of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness on comprehensive guidelines
23	and procedures including but not limited to the following:
24	(a) Projected or anticipated costs.
25	(b) Checklists for requesting and providing assistance.
26	(c) Recordkeeping for all parishes.
27	(d) Reimbursement procedures.
28	(e) Any necessary implementation elements such as forms for requests and
29	other records documenting deployment and return of assets.

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1	E. Implementations; limitations
2	(1) A parish may request assistance of any other parish in preventing,
3	mitigating, responding to, and recovering from emergencies or disasters as defined
4	in R.S. 29:723, in an event that exceeds a parish's capability or resources, or in
5	concert with authorized drills or exercises. Requests for assistance shall be made
6	through the Office of Emergency Preparedness of the requesting parish and directed
7	to the Office of Emergency Preparedness of the responding parish. Requests shall
8	be in writing and reported to the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and
9	Emergency Preparedness as soon as is practicable. Nothing in this Section shall be
10	interpreted to impair the authority of the parish president with regard to his powers
11	during a declared emergency.
12	(2) The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
13	Preparedness may request assistance from any parish for the purpose of establishing
14	a pre-positioned cache of resources in order to expedite requests in the wake of an
15	anticipated disaster and may also request resources from any parish in order to help
16	fill requests for assistance received from other states as part of a national mutual aid
17	system.
18	(3) The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency
19	Preparedness shall, in coordination with the Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee,
20	develop guidance and procedures governing the implementation of this Section in
21	accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
22	(4) The obligation of the responding parish to provide assistance is subject
23	to the following limitations:
24	(a) First responders of a responding parish shall remain subject to recall by
25	their responding jurisdiction, will continue to utilize their customary skills and
26	techniques, and standard operating procedures to include medical procedures and
27	protocols, and other procedures and protocols, but shall be under the direction and
28	control of the appropriate officials within the incident management system of the
29	parish receiving the assistance.

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1	(b) Assets and equipment of a responding parish shall remain subject to
2	recall by their responding jurisdiction, but shall be under the direction and control
3	of the appropriate officials within the incident management system of the parish
4	receiving the assistance.
5	F. Reimbursements
6	A request for reimbursement shall be in accordance with procedures
7	developed by the Intrastate Mutual Aid Subcommittee.
8	G. License; certificate; permit portability
9	If a person or entity holds a license, certificate, or other permit issued by a
10	parish or the state evidencing qualification in a professional, mechanical, or other
11	skill, and the assistance of that person or entity is requested by a parish, the person
12	or entity shall be deemed to be licensed, certified, or permitted in the parish
13	requesting assistance for the duration of the event and subject to any limitations and
14	conditions the chief executive of the parish receiving the assistance may prescribe
15	by executive order or otherwise.
16	H. Workers' Compensation
17	Personnel authorized by their employer to respond to an event who sustain
18	injury or death in the course and scope of their employment remain entitled to all
19	applicable benefits normally available pursuant to their employment even though
20	they may be under the direction and control of another governmental entity.
