WEAPONS/FIREARMS: Provides with respect to the possession of a firearm or carrying a concealed weapon by a person convicted of certain felonies

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 14:95.1(C), relative to the possession of a firearm or carrying a
3	concealed weapon by a person convicted of certain felonies; to remove the
4	authorization for law enforcement to issue permits allowing certain felons to possess
5	firearms or carry concealed weapons; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 14:95.1(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§95.1. Possession of firearm or carrying concealed weapon by a person convicted
9	of certain felonies

11	C. Except as otherwise specifically provided, this Section shall not apply to
12	the following cases:
13	(1) The provisions of this Section prohibiting the possession of firearms and
14	carrying concealed weapons by persons who have been convicted of certain felonies
15	shall not apply to any person who has not been convicted of any felony for a period
16	of ten years from the date of completion of sentence, probation, parole, or suspension
17	of sentence.
18	(2) Upon completion of sentence, probation, parole, or suspension of
19	sentence the convicted felon shall have the right to apply to the sheriff of the parish
20	in which he resides, or in the case of Orleans Parish the superintendent of police, for

1	a permit to possess firearms. The felon shall be entitled to possess the firearm upon
2	the issuing of the permit.
3	(3) The sheriff or superintendent of police, as the case may be, shall
4	immediately notify the Department of Public Safety, in writing, of the issuance of
5	each permit granted under this Section.

Abstract: Removes the authority of law enforcement to issue a permit allowing persons convicted of certain felonies to possess a firearm or carry a concealed weapon.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits persons convicted of certain felony offenses from possessing firearms or carrying concealed weapons.

<u>Present law</u> further provides for the following exceptions to the prohibition:

- (1) Any person who has not been convicted of any felony for a period of 10 years from the date of completion of sentence, probation, parole, or suspension of sentence.
- (2) Upon completion of sentence, probation, parole, or suspension of sentence, the convicted felon shall have the right to apply to the sheriff of the parish in which he resides, or in the case of Orleans Parish the superintendent of police, for a permit to possess firearms. The felon shall be entitled to possess the firearm upon the issuing of the permit.
- (3) The sheriff or superintendent of police, as the case may be, shall immediately notify DPS&C, in writing, of the issuance of each permit granted.

<u>Proposed law</u> removes the authorization for law enforcement agencies to issue permits as provided for in paragraphs (2) and (3) above and otherwise retains <u>present law</u>.
