R.S. 14:97 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 7 §97. Simple obstruction of a highway of commerce 8 A. Simple obstruction of a highway of commerce is either of the following: 9 (1) the The intentional or criminally negligent placing of anything or the 10 intentional or criminally negligent performance of any act on any railway, railroad, 11 navigable waterway, road, highway, thoroughfare, or runway of an airport, which 12 will render movement thereon more difficult. 13 (2) The conspiracy or aiding and abetting of other individuals to commit 14 either the intentional or criminally negligent placing of anything or the intentional 15 or criminally negligent performance of any act on any railway, railroad, navigable 16 waterway, road, highway, thoroughfare, or runway of an airport, which will render 17 movement thereon more difficult. 18 B. Whoever commits the crime of simple obstruction of a highway of 19 commerce in a manner that violates the provisions of this Section shall be fined not 20 more than two seven hundred fifty dollars, or imprisoned for not more than six 21 months, or both.
