| 7 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 8 | Section 1. R.S. 17:158(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: |
| 9 | §158. School buses for transportation of students; employment of bus operators; |
| 10 | alternative means of transportation; improvement of school bus turnarounds |
| 11 | A.(1) Except as provided by Subsection H of this Section and in accordance |
| 12 | with the requirements of Subsection F of this Section, each city, parish, and city |
| 13 | other local public school board shall provide free transportation for any student |
| 14 | attending a school of suitable grade approved by the State Board of Elementary and |
| 15 | Secondary Education within the jurisdictional boundaries of the parish or school |
| 16 | <u>local</u> board if the student resides more than one mile from such school. |
| 17 | (2) The Terrebonne Parish School Board A city, parish, or other local public |
| 18 | school board may provide transportation for any student attending a school of |
| 19 | suitable grade approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education |
| 20 | within the jurisdictional boundaries of the parish or school local board who resides |
| 21 | one mile or less from the school when the school board determines that conditions |

exist to warrant such transportation. Transportation of students residing one mile or less from their school shall be at no cost to the state.

(3) The Beauregard Parish School Board, the Cameron Parish School Board, the East Feliciana Parish School Board, the Grant Parish School Board, the Iberville Parish School Board, the Morehouse Parish School Board, the Natchitoches Parish School Board, the Pointe Coupee Parish School Board, the Rapides Parish School Board, the Red River Parish School Board, the Sabine Parish School Board, the Vernon Parish School Board, the West Baton Rouge Parish School Board, the West Carroll Parish School Board, the West Feliciana Parish School Board, and the Winn Parish School Board may provide transportation for any student attending a school of suitable grade approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education within the jurisdictional boundaries of the parish or school board who resides one mile or less from the school when the school board determines that conditions exist to warrant such transportation. Transportation of students residing one mile or less from their school shall be at no cost to the state. Conditions that exist and warrant transportation as authorized by Paragraph (2) of this Subsection may include but shall not be limited to the residence location of a person convicted of a sex offense as defined in R.S. 15:541 relative to registration of sex offenders, sexually violent predators, and child predators.

(4) For such the purposes of this Subsection, any parish or city, parish, or other local public school board may employ school bus operators as hereinafter defined in R.S. 17:491. However, nothing in this Section shall prohibit a parish or city, parish, or other local public school board from entering into contracts or mutual agreements for providing school bus transportation.

Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall supersede the provisions of that Act which originated as House Bill No. 151 of the 2010 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana.

Section 3. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
