COURTS/JUSTICE OF PEACE: Provides for parish-wide jurisdiction for justice of the peace courts for automated traffic enforcement system violations

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 13:2586(G), relative to justice of the peace courts; to provide with respect to  
3 automated traffic enforcement systems; to provide for jurisdiction; and to provide for  
4 related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 13:2586(G) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §2586. Jurisdiction and procedure

8 \* \* \*

9 G. A justice of the peace shall have concurrent civil jurisdiction over  
10 violations occurring anywhere in the parish in which the court is situated when the  
11 violation involves any ordinance which authorizes the use of an automated traffic  
12 enforcement system on any public street, road, or highway and which results in the  
13 issuance of a citation or notice of the violation by mail.
