7	Section 1. R.S. 17:3048.1(Y) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§3048.1. Program awards; eligibility; amounts; limitations; funding; administration

10	Y. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Chapter to the contrary and in
11	addition to other applicable eligibility requirements provided by this Chapter,
12	beginning with the 2013-2014 school year and thereafter, in order to qualify for an
13	Opportunity Award, a student who graduates from a public high school or a
14	nonpublic high school which has been approved by the State Board of Elementary
15	and Secondary School shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75
16	calculated on a 4.00 scale by using only the grades obtained by the student in
17	completing the core curriculum requirements established by this Section.

Abstract: Relative to TOPS, provides (beginning with the 2013-2014 school year and thereafter) that a student who graduates from a public high school or BESE-approved nonpublic high school shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 calculated on a 4.00 scale using grades obtained in completing the core curriculum requirements.

<u>Proposed law</u> (notwithstanding any provisions of <u>present law</u> to the contrary and in addition to other applicable <u>present law</u> eligibility requirements) provides that beginning with the 2013-2014 school year and thereafter, in order to qualify for an Opportunity Award, a student who graduates from a public high school or a nonpublic high school which has been approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary School shall have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 calculated on a 4.00 scale by using only the grades obtained by the student in completing the core curriculum requirements established by <u>present law</u>.
