WEAPONS/HANDGUNS: Authorizes off-duty law enforcement officers to carry concealed handguns in certain facilities

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 14:95.5(C), relative to the possession of a firearm on the 3 premises of an alcoholic beverage outlet; to provide for an exception for certain off-4 duty law enforcement officers; and to provide for related matters. 5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 6 Section 1. R.S. 14:95.5(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 7 §95.5. Possession of firearm on premises of alcoholic beverage outlet 8 9 C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to the owner or lessee of an 10 alcoholic beverage outlet, or to an employee of such owner or lessee, or to a law 11 enforcement officer or other person vested with law enforcement authority acting in 12 the performance of his official duties, or an off-duty law enforcement officer who 13 is not consuming alcohol. 14

Henry Burns HB No. 15

Abstract: Creates an exception to the prohibition against carrying firearms in an alcoholic beverage outlet for off-duty law enforcement officers who are not consuming alcohol.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits any person from possessing a firearm while on the premises of an alcoholic beverage outlet and provides for criminal penalties including a maximum fine of \$500, a term of imprisonment for not more than six months, or both.

<u>Present law</u> contains exceptions for the owner or lessee of the establishment, an employee of the establishment, or a law enforcement officer acting in the performance of his official duties.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains the provisions of <u>present law</u> and creates an additional exception for off-duty law enforcement officers who are not consuming alcohol.
