8	Section 1. R.S. 14:133.6(A) and (C) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S.
9	14:133.6(B)(3) and (4) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§133.6. Filing a false lien against a law enforcement officer, or court officer, state
11	officer, or state employee
12	A. The crime of filing a false lien or encumbrance against a law enforcement
13	officer, or court officer, state officer, or state employee is committed when a person
14	knowingly files, attempts to file, or conspires to file, in any public records or in any
15	private record that is generally available to the public, any false lien or encumbrance
16	against the real or personal movable or immovable property of a law enforcement
17	officer, or court officer, state officer, or state employee, as retaliation against the
18	officer or employee for the performance of his official duties, knowing or having
19	reason to know that such the lien or encumbrance is false or contains any materially
20	false, fictitious, or fraudulent statement or representation.
21	B. For purposes of this Section, the following definitions shall apply:

23	(3) "State employee" shall mean any person in the classified or unclassified
24	service for the state of Louisiana.

(4) "State officer" shall mean any person holding an elective office or appointive office for the state of Louisiana.

C.(1) Whoever commits the crime of filing a false lien against a law

C.(1) Whoever commits the crime of filing a false lien against a law enforcement officer, or court officer, state officer, or state employee shall be fined not less than five hundred dollars nor more than the amount of the value of the false lien or encumbrance, imprisoned, with or without hard labor, for not more than two years, or both.

(2) The court, in addition to any punishment imposed under the provisions of this Section, may order the offender to pay restitution to the law enforcement officer, or court officer, state officer, or state employee for any costs incurred as a result of the false lien or encumbrance.
