ACT No. 257

BY REPRESENTATIVE HENRY BURNS AND LITTLE

Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 32:408(B)(7), relative to commercial driver's licenses; to provide for a waiver
3 of certain requirements for certain commercial drivers; and to provide for related
4 matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 32:408(B)(7) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

7 §408. Examination of applicants required; classes of licenses

11 (7)(a) Commercial driver applicants not meeting the physical standards as
12 set forth in 49 CFR 391.41(b)(10), pertaining to vision requirements, may apply to
13 the department for an intrastate driver waiver. Minimum vision requirements for
14 such waiver are as follows:

15 (i) Distant visual acuity of at least 20/40 (Snellen) or better in at least one
16 eye with or without corrective lenses.

17 (ii) Field of vision of at least seventy degrees in one direction and thirty-five
18 in the other direction of the horizontal meridian of the applicant's better eye.

19 (iii) The ability to distinguish colors of signals and devices showing standard
20 red, green, and amber as demonstrated by ishihara color plates or their equivalent.

21 (b) The applicant for the waiver shall supply the department with the
22 following information when requesting the waiver:

23 (i) A copy of the medical examination performed pursuant to 49 CFR
24 391.43.

1 (ii) A copy of any medical certificate issued as a result of a medical
2 examination completed pursuant to 49 CFR 391.43.

3 (iii) A medical evaluation completed by an optometrist certified by the
4 Louisiana State Board of Optometry Examiners to treat diseases and disorders of the
5 eye and its adnexa or an ophthalmologist certified by the American Board of
6 Ophthalmology. If the visual impairment is a progressive disorder, a medical
7 evaluation completed by an optometrist certified by the Louisiana State Board of
8 Optometry Examiners to treat diseases and disorders of the eye and its adnexa or an
9 ophthalmologist certified by the American Board of Ophthalmology as required in
10 this Item shall be supplied to the department every six months for the duration of the
11 waiver.

12 (iv) A copy of the driver applicant's road test and certificate issued pursuant
13 to 49 CFR 391.31(b) through (g).

14 (v) A copy of the driver applicant's previous waiver of certain physical
15 defects, when applicable.

16 (vi) The class of vehicle to be used by the applicant, if granted a waiver. To
17 qualify for the waiver, the applicant shall have had two years commercial driving
18 experience within the five years immediately preceding the application date for the
19 class of vehicle indicated. This driving experience shall be verified by a notarized
20 statement provided by the applicant's current or previous employers or by himself,
21 if self-employed.

22 (vii) Evidence, on a form approved by the department, that the applicant has
23 successfully passed a skills test administered by an authorized third party for the
24 class of vehicle to be used by the applicant, if granted a waiver. The skills test shall
25 be administered following the diagnosis which prevents the applicant from failing
26 to meet the physical standards set forth in 49 CFR 391.41(b)(10), pertaining to vision
27 requirements. The skills test required by this Item shall be required only upon the
28 initial application for a waiver issued pursuant to this Paragraph.

29 (c) The department shall issue an intrastate driver waiver to an applicant if
30 it finds that he meets the minimum vision requirements as stated by Subparagraph

1 (a) and Items (b)(i) through (iii) of this Paragraph, and granting the waiver would
 2 likely achieve a level of safety that is equivalent to, or greater than, the level that
 3 would be achieved absent such waiver.

4 (d) Applicants granted a waiver shall drive only within the territorial limits
 5 of Louisiana.

6 (e) Applicants who are issued a waiver are prohibited from transporting
 7 passengers for hire, manifested hazardous wastes, or hazardous material required to
 8 be placarded.

9 (f) Waivers granted pursuant to this Paragraph shall be valid for the duration
 10 of the applicant's commercial driver's license. An applicant desiring a waiver
 11 pursuant to this Paragraph shall reapply for the waiver each time he renews his
 12 commercial driver's license. The skills test required by Item (b)(vii) of this
 13 Paragraph shall be required only upon the initial application for a waiver issued
 14 pursuant to this Paragraph.

15 (g) Nothing in this Paragraph shall be construed to relieve a commercial
 16 driver of any of his responsibilities required by state or federal law, rule, or
 17 regulation.

18 (h) The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor
 19 vehicles, may, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, promulgate
 20 rules and regulations for the efficient implementation and enforcement of this
 21 Paragraph.
