AGRICULTURE: Clarifies the minimum deficiency assessment and inspection fee for commercial feeds

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 3:1400(A)(introductory paragraph) and 1401(C)(1), relative to
3 commercial feeds; to clarify the minimum deficiency assessment; to clarify
4 minimum inspection fees; and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 3:1400(A)(introductory paragraph) and 1401(C)(1) are hereby
7 amended and reenacted to read as follows:

8 §1400. Deficiency assessments; enforcement

9 A. If a given lot or shipment of feed is found by official sample and analysis
10 to be deficient in one or more of the guaranteed feeding units, a deficiency
11 assessment of no less than ten dollars, shall be assessed against the registrant with
12 respect to the lot or shipment of feed in question in accordance with the following
13 provisions:

17 C.(1) Except as provided in Subsection E of this Section, each registrant who
18 manufactures a commercial or customer-formula feed for distribution in this state
19 shall pay the commission an inspection fee of one dollar per ton on all commercial
20 feed sold in the state. Payment of the inspection fee shall be made on the basis of
