HOUSE BILL NO. 18

CENSUS: Provides relative to provisions in Title 40 which are limited in applicability to political subdivisions or local areas meeting specified population characteristics (Item #8)

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AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 40:401.1, 404.1, 490(C), 531(A)(2), (B), and (C), 537(A)(3), 1241(A)(2), 1496(G)(1), 1498(E) and (F), 1501.5(A), 1502.14, 1502.15(A), and 1509 and to repeal R.S. 40:404, relative to provisions of Title 40 (Public Health and Safety) of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 which are limited in applicability to certain political subdivisions or local areas based upon population classifications; to specify applicability to one or more political subdivisions or local areas; to repeal provisions that are outdated or obsolete; and to provide for related matters.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 40:401.1, 404.1, 490(C), 531(A)(2), (B), and (C), 537(A)(3), 1241(A)(2), 1496(G)(1), 1498(E) and (F), 1501.5(A), 1502.14, 1502.15(A), and 1509 are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

~~§401.1. Housing authorities of certain parishes~~ authority of the parish of St. Landry;
commissioners

~~In parishes having a population in excess of eighty-five thousand but not more than eighty-nine thousand, based on the latest federal decennial census~~ the parish of St. Landry, the board of commissioners shall be composed of no more than six members. A majority of the commissioners shall constitute a quorum of the

1 authority for the purpose of conducting its business and exercising its power and for
2 all other purposes.

4 §404.1. Housing authorities of ~~certain~~ the cities of Gonzales and St. Martinville; per
5 diem

6 Each commissioner of the housing authority of a city with a population of not
7 ~~less than seven thousand one hundred fifty persons and not more than seven~~
8 ~~thousand two hundred fifty persons as of the most recent federal decennial census~~
9 authorities of the cities of Gonzales and St. Martinville may receive a per diem, to
10 be paid from funds of the respective housing authority, for a maximum of twenty-
11 four days per year for attendance at meetings of the respective housing authority in
12 amounts not to exceed the following:

13 (1) Fifty dollars for the chairman of the authority.

14 (2) Twenty-five dollars for all other members.

18 C. Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection B of this Section, ~~any~~
19 ~~parish with a population of in excess of three hundred fifty thousand persons but not~~

21 ~~federal decennial census, the parish of East Baton Rouge~~ and any municipality or
22 school board in ~~the~~ that parish may exercise any of the powers granted in Subsection
23 B of this Section. A housing authority in ~~any such~~ the parish of East Baton Rouge
24 shall make payments in lieu of taxes to a school district in which the housing
25 authority is located.

1 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, when the
2 governing body of ~~any parish with a population of not more than forty-three~~
3 ~~thousand seven hundred fifty persons and not less than forty-two thousand seven~~
4 ~~hundred fifty persons based on the latest federal decennial census~~ the parish of St.
5 John the Baptist has determined, by resolution as set forth in R.S. 40:393, that it is
6 expedient to establish a local housing authority, the governing body of ~~any such that~~
7 parish shall appoint five persons who shall constitute the governing body of the local
8 housing authority and shall be called commissioners.

9 B. In ~~municipalities with populations of four hundred seventy-five thousand~~
10 ~~or more~~ the city of New Orleans, the governing authority of the housing authority
11 shall consist of seven commissioners, at least two of whom shall be tenants of the
12 housing authority. The commissioners shall be appointed by the mayor of the
13 ~~municipality~~ city of New Orleans and shall serve terms concurrent with that of the
14 mayor. The tenant commissioners shall be chosen from a list of names submitted to
15 the mayor by the Citywide Tenants Council, Inc., of the housing authority. The
16 number of names submitted shall be three for each vacancy to be filled by a tenant
17 commissioner. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term.

18 C. In ~~parishes with populations of more than four hundred thirty-five~~
19 ~~thousand but less than four hundred seventy-five thousand and not having boundaries~~
20 ~~coterminous with a single city~~ the parish of Jefferson, the governing authority of the
21 housing authority shall consist of nine commissioners and, notwithstanding any other
22 provision of law to the contrary, such commissioners shall be appointed as provided
23 in this Subsection. Seven of the commissioners shall be appointed by the governing
24 body of the parish. One of such commissioners shall be appointed by the chief
25 executive officer of the parish. One of such commissioners shall be a tenant member
26 of the Marrero Tenants Organization and shall be appointed by the governing
27 authority of said organization.

7 ~~decennial census~~ the parish of St. John the Baptist may be removed on any such
8 grounds by the governing body of the parish appointing the commissioner.

14 (2) Permanent open-air public market buildings built prior to 1950 which are
15 designated as historic and located in ~~a municipality with a population in excess of~~
16 ~~four hundred thousand persons according to the most recent federal decennial census~~
17 the city of New Orleans shall be exempt from LAC 51:XXIII.1501, 1701, and
18 3505(A). The lessor shall develop food service operational guidelines after
19 consultation and periodic review with the Department of Health and Hospitals. Such
20 food service operational guidelines shall be incorporated into the lease agreements
21 with lessees who operate food service establishments in the exempted area. The
22 lessor shall enforce such food service operational guidelines through leases with
23 their lessees.

27 G.(1) When four or more municipalities are included within the boundaries
28 of a district lying within ~~a parish with a population of between sixteen thousand and~~

1 of Claiborne, Grant, or Winn, in addition to the membership provided in Paragraph
2 B(B)(4) of this Section, the respective parish governing authority may appoint up to
3 three additional members to the board.

7 E. Notwithstanding the amount of the per diem authorized by Subsection A
8 of this Section but otherwise in accordance therewith, all members of the governing
9 board of any fire protection district located wholly within a ~~parish having a~~

11 ~~as of the most recent federal decennial census,~~ the parish of St. Landry may be paid
12 a per diem of eighty dollars for attending meetings of the board, not to exceed two
13 meetings in any one calendar month, and thirty dollars for attending committee
14 meetings, not to exceed two in any month.

16 members of the governing board of any fire protection district located wholly within
17 a ~~parish having a population of not less than one hundred ninety-one thousand nor~~

20 dollars for attending meetings of the board, not to exceed two meetings in any one

27 A. Fire protection districts in ~~parishes with a population between ninety-nine~~
28 ~~thousand and one hundred three thousand~~ the parish of Tangipahoa are hereby
29 authorized to levy and collect a one-half of one percent sales and use tax within each

6 Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary applicable to any fire
7 protection district, any requirement that insurers and insurance agents have proof of
8 a current service charge receipt from an insured prior to considering granting any
9 reduced rate because of fire district protection to the insured shall not apply in
10 ~~parishes with a population of not less than thirty thousand but not more than thirty-~~
11 ~~one thousand two hundred fifty based on the latest federal decennial census~~ the
12 parish of Morehouse.

13 §1502.15. Service charge authorized for fire protection districts in ~~certain parishes~~
14 the parish of Caddo; assessment and collection

15 A. The governing authority of any fire protection district located within a
16 ~~parish with a population of not less than two hundred forty thousand people nor more~~
17 ~~than three hundred fifty thousand people, based on the latest federal decennial~~
18 ~~census~~, the parish of Caddo is hereby authorized to establish, by majority vote of the
19 members of the authority, a service charge or rates of service charges to be assessed
20 persons owning each residential or commercial structure, whether occupied or
21 unoccupied, located wholly or partly within the boundaries of the district, subject to
22 the provisions of Subsection B of this Section. For purposes of this Section, each
23 residential or commercial unit in a structure and each housing unit within a multiple
24 dwelling structure shall be considered a separate structure, and a mobile home, as
25 defined in R.S. 9:1149.2, shall be considered a structure. Such service charges or
26 rates of service charges shall be established by the governing authority of such
27 district and shall be framed so as to cover and shall be used for the costs either

1 incurred or for contracting of any or all fire protection, emergency medical
2 transportation, and all emergency services incidental thereto.

4 §1509. Appointment of board of commissioners of certain fire protection districts

5 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the board of
6 commissioners of a fire protection district in ~~any parish with a population of not less~~
7 ~~than forty thousand and not more than forty-three thousand five hundred persons~~
8 according to the most recent decennial census the parishes of Avoyelles, Lincoln, St.
9 John the Baptist, and Webster shall be comprised of at least one member from each
10 ward located within the boundaries of the district. The respective parish governing
11 ~~authority~~ authorities shall implement this Section by providing for appointment of
12 members, including those from municipalities, in such manner, and by adding such
13 members, as shall be necessary to implement these provisions.

14 Section 2. R.S. 40:404 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Abstract: Updates applicability of provisions in Title 40 as a result of the 2010 census.

Proposed law, contained in Title 40 (Public Health and Safety) of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, legislates with regard to classifications of parishes, municipalities, or other political subdivisions or local areas according to population by enacting local bills to limit the application of laws based upon specific classifications to one or more parishes, municipalities, or other political subdivisions or local areas, as indicated in the following chart.

Proposed law repeals obsolete Section of present law providing for meeting frequency and meeting location of housing authority boards in municipalities of a population of 475,000 or more.
