HOUSE BILL NO. 214

BY REPRESENTATIVE DIXON

Prefiled pursuant to Article III, Section 2(A)(4)(b)(i) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

1 AN ACT

2 To enact R.S. 11:2220(B)(2)(c), relative to the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement  
3 System; to allow a member to designate a trustee for survivor benefits payable to a  
4 child; to provide an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

5 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published  
6 as provided by Article X, Section 29(C) of the Constitution  
7 of Louisiana.

8 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

9 Section 1. R.S. 11:2220(B)(2)(c) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

10 §2220. Benefits; contribution limit

12 B. Benefits shall be payable to any survivor of an active contributing  
13 member who dies before retirement or a disability retiree who dies after retirement  
14 as specified in the following:

18 (c) If at the time of a member's death the member is not married to the  
19 natural parent of any child or children who are entitled to receive a payment pursuant  
20 to this Subsection and if a trust has been created by the deceased member for the  
21 benefit of such child or children, the payment shall be made to any person designated  
22 as a trustee by the member on a certified copy of a trust document submitted to the  
23 system by the member.

1           Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not  
2 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature  
3 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If  
4 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become  
5 effective on the day following such approval.
