2	To amend and reenact R.S. 49:163 and to enact R.S. 49:163.1, relative to state symbols; to
3	provide for the state gemstone; to provide for the use of the gemstone on official
4	documents; to provide for a state mineral; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 49:163 is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 49:163.1 is hereby
7	enacted to read as follows:
8	§163. State gemstone
9	There shall be an official state gemstone. The official state gemstone shall
10	be the agate, as found in Louisiana gravel the cabochon cut gemstone, derived from
11	the Crassostrea virginica mollusk predominantly found in the waters of coastal
12	Louisiana. Its use on official documents of the state and with the insignia of the state
13	is hereby authorized.
14	§163.1. State mineral
15	There shall be an official state mineral. The official state mineral shall be the
16	agate, as found in Louisiana gravel. Its use on official documents of the state and
17	with the insignia of the state is hereby authorized.

Simon HB No. 246

Abstract: Changes the state gemstone from agate to the cabochon cut gemstone derived from the Crassostrea virginica mollusk and provides that agate shall be the state mineral.

Present law provides that the state gemstone shall be agate.

<u>Proposed law</u> changes the state gemstone <u>from</u> agate <u>to</u> the cabochon cut gemstone, derived from the Crassostrea virginica mollusk predominantly found in the waters of coastal La.

<u>Proposed law</u> names agate as the state mineral.
