BUDGETARY CONTROLS: Provides relative to the state's operating budget

AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 39:2(3), (6), (26), (27), and (45), 34(A), 36(A)(introductory
3	paragraph), and 51(B) and to enact R.S. 39:36(B)(9), relative to the state's operating
4	budget; to provide with respect to the executive budget; to provide with respect to
5	appropriation bills; to provide with respect to definitions; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 39:2(3), (6), (26), (27), and (45), 34(A), 36(A)(introductory
9	paragraph), and 51(B) are hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. 39:36(B)(9) is hereby
10	enacted to read as follows:
11	§2. Definitions
12	As used in this Chapter, except where the context clearly requires otherwise,
13	the words and expressions defined in this Section shall be held to have the meanings
14	here given to them.
15	* * *
16	(3) "Appropriation" means an authorization by the legislature to a budget
17	unit for a program to expend from public funds a sum of money, for purposes and
18	under the conditions designated, under the procedure prescribed in this Chapter.

2	explanations, in which a budget unit states its financial requirements needs and
3	requests appropriations to cover those needs.

5	(26) "Money available for appropriation" means the <u>total</u> amount of money
6	to be received for a fiscal year by the state general fund and dedicated funds,
7	exclusive of federal funds and those amounts appropriated or allocated by the
8	Constitution of Louisiana.
9	(27) "Nonrecurring revenue" means revenue received by the state from a any
10	source identified by the Revenue Estimating Conference as being of a nonrecurring
11	nature. "Nonrecurring revenue" does not include revenues received by the state from
12	any source which has been available for the preceding two fiscal years or which will
13	be available for the succeeding two fiscal years.

15	(45) "Supporting document" means the document prepared by the budget
16	office and composed of supporting information, data, and documentation used to
17	develop the executive budget and information, data, and documentation required by
18	statute. The data elements comprising the supporting document shall be as provided
19	by law.

21	§34. Executive budget
22	A. The governor shall cause to be prepared an executive budget presenting
23	a complete and detailed financial and programmatic plan for the ensuing fiscal year
24	which shall include recommendations for appropriations from the state general fund
25	and dedicated funds which shall not exceed the official forecast of the Revenue
26	Estimating Conference.

1	§36. Contents and format of executive budget; supporting document
2	A. The executive budget shall present a complete and detailed financial and
3	programmatic plan for the ensuing year, and it shall be configured in a format so as
4	to clearly present and highlight the functions and operations of state government and
5	the financial requirements associated with those functions and operations. The
6	executive budget shall be a performance-based budget. It shall include at a minimum
7	the following:

9	B. The budget office shall prepare a document known as the supporting
10	document which shall be in conformity with the executive budget and shall include,
11	at a minimum, the following:

13	(9) All information, data, and documentation that is statutorily required.

15	§51. General Appropriation Bill; other appropriation bills

17	B. The General Appropriation Bill and the bill appropriating funds for
18	ancillary expenses of state government shall include for each program, department,
19	and budget unit, comparative statements of the number of <u>all</u> authorized positions
20	and of the existing operating budget for a date certain to be established by the budget
21	office for the current fiscal year and the appropriations for the ensuing fiscal year.

**Abstract:** Provides definitions and required documentation for the executive budget and supporting documentation.

Present law defines certain terms for purposes of the state's budget.

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<u>Present law</u> defines "appropriation" as an authorization by the legislature to a budget unit for a program to expend from public funds a sum of money for purposes designated. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds that the expenditure of public funds must not only be for the purposes designated but also under the conditions designated.

<u>Present law</u> defines "budget request" as the document with its accompanying explanations, in which a budget unit states its financial requirements and requests appropriations. <u>Proposed law</u> redefines "budget request" as the document with its accompanying explanations, in which a budget unit states its financial needs and requests appropriations to cover those needs.

<u>Present law</u> defines "money available for appropriation" as the amount of money to be received for a fiscal year by the state general fund and dedicated funds, exclusive of federal funds and those amounts appropriated or allocated by the Constitution of La. <u>Proposed law</u> retains present law and specifies that the amount of money means the total amount of money.

<u>Present law</u> defines "nonrecurring revenue" as revenue received by the state from a source identified by the Revenue Estimating Conference as being of a nonrecurring nature. <u>Proposed law retains present law</u> and specifies that "source" includes any source.

<u>Present law</u> defines, in part, "supporting document" as the document prepared by the budget office and composed of supporting information, data, and documentation used to develop the executive budget. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and adds, in addition to supporting information, data, and documentation, that the supporting document must also include information, data, and documentation that is required by statute.

<u>Present law</u> requires the governor to prepare an executive budget which presents a complete financial and programmatic plan for the ensuring fiscal year. <u>Proposed law</u> requires, in addition to complete, that the plan must also be detailed.

<u>Present law</u> requires the division of administration's budget office to prepare supporting documents in conformity with the executive budget and containing certain, specified information. <u>Proposed law</u> adds that the supporting documents must also contain all information, data, and documentation that is required by statute.

<u>Present law</u> requires, in part, that the General Appropriation Bill and the bill appropriating funds for ancillary expenses of state government must include for each program, department, and budget unit, comparative statements of the number of authorized positions. <u>Proposed law</u> specifies that the required information must include the number of all authorized positions.
