EDUCATION/SPECIAL: Requires the use of video cameras in classrooms where special education services are provided to certain students with exceptionalities

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 44:4.1(B)(9) and to enact R.S. 17:1948 and 3996(B)(54), relative
3	to students with exceptionalities; to require public school governing authorities to
4	provide for cameras in classrooms and other education settings where certain
5	students with exceptionalities receive special education and related services; to
6	require the adoption of policies relative to cameras; to provide a limitation relative
7	to public records; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 17:1948 and 3996(B)(54) are hereby enacted to read as follows:
10	§1948. Cameras; students with exceptionalities
11	A. The governing authority of each public elementary and secondary school
12	shall provide, pursuant to policies it shall adopt for such purpose, for the installation
13	and operation of cameras that record both video and audio in classrooms and other
14	educational settings where certain students with exceptionalities receive special
15	education and related services. Such policies, at a minimum, shall provide for the
16	following:
17	(1) The location and placement of cameras, including a prohibition against
18	the recording of the interior of a restroom or any other area in which a student's
19	clothing may be changed or removed.

1	(2) A requirement that written notice of the cameras be provided to teachers
2	and other school employees, students, parents, and authorized visitors.
3	(3) A requirement that any teacher or other school employee who provides
4	services in such a classroom or educational setting receive training concerning the
5	provisions of this Section.
6	(4) Provisions relative to the duration of the retention of the video and audio
7	data recorded and procedures for data storage and disposal, including a requirement
8	that the data be retained for at least one year from the recording date.
9	(5) Procedures for protecting student privacy and for determining to whom
10	and under what circumstances the data may be disclosed. Such policies shall provide
11	for viewing only by the superintendent or his designee and by the parent of a
12	recorded student upon the parent's request. Such policies shall require the redaction
13	of footage of students other than the parent's child. Such policies shall also require
14	any person who views a recording showing what he believes could be a violation of
15	state law or federal law to report it to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
16	(6) A requirement that any camera installed pursuant to this Section be in
17	compliance with the National Fire Protection Association Life Safety regulations.
18	B.(1) Recordings made pursuant to this Section shall be confidential and
19	shall not be public records; however, a recording may be viewed by the
20	superintendent or his designee, by parents, or by law enforcement officials as
21	provided in the policy required by Paragraph (A)(5) of this Section.
22	(2) Such data shall not be considered "personally identifiable information"
23	as defined in R.S. 17:3914.
24	C. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to special education
25	classrooms and other special education settings where the only students with
26	exceptionalities receiving special education and related services are those who have
27	been deemed to be gifted or talented and have not been identified as also having a
28	disability.

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1	§3996. Charter schools; exemptions; requirements
2	* * *
3	B. Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and
4	except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a
5	charter school established and operated in accordance with the provisions of this
6	Chapter and its approved charter and the school's officers and employees shall be
7	exempt from all statutory mandates or other statutory requirements that are
8	applicable to public schools and to public school officers and employees except for
9	the following laws otherwise applicable to public schools with the same grades:

13	Section 2. R.S. 44:4.1(B)(9) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
14	§4.1. Exceptions

16	B. The legislature further recognizes that there exist exceptions, exemptions,
17	and limitations to the laws pertaining to public records throughout the revised
18	statutes and codes of this state. Therefore, the following exceptions, exemptions, and
19	limitations are hereby continued in effect by incorporation into this Chapter by
20	citation:

DIGEST

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Abstract: Requires video cameras in classrooms and other educational settings where certain students with exceptionalities receive special education and related services.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the governing authority of each public school, including charter schools, to provide, pursuant to policies it adopts for such purpose, for the installation and operation of cameras that record both video and audio in classrooms and other educational settings where students with exceptionalities receive special education and related services. Requires such policies, at a minimum, to provide for the following:

- (1) The location and placement of cameras, including a prohibition against recording restroom interiors or other areas in which clothing may be changed or removed.
- (2) A requirement that written notice of the cameras be provided to teachers and other school employees, students, parents, and authorized visitors.
- (3) A requirement that any teacher or other school employee who provides services in such a classroom or educational setting receive training concerning proposed law.
- (4) Provisions relative to the duration of the retention of the audio and video data recorded on the cameras and procedures for data storage and disposal, which shall require that data be retained for at least one year from the date of the recording.
- (5) Procedures for protecting student privacy and determining to whom and under what circumstances the data may be disclosed. Such policies shall provide for viewing only by the superintendent or his designee and by the parent of a recorded student upon the parent's request; require redaction of footage of students other than the parent's child; and require any person who views a recording showing what he believes could be a violation of law to report it to law enforcement.
- (6) A requirement that cameras comply with national fire safety standards.

Proposed law also provides:

- (1) That <u>proposed law</u> shall not apply to classrooms and other special education settings where the only students with exceptionalities who are receiving special education and related services are those who have been deemed to be gifted or talented and who have not been identified as also having a disability.
- (2) That recordings made pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> shall be confidential and shall not be public records but may be viewed by the superintendent or his designee, by parents, or by law enforcement as provided in the policy required by <u>proposed law</u>.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits school officials and employees from sharing a student's "personally identifiable information", defined, in part, as information about an individual that can be used to identify, contact, or locate him. <u>Proposed law</u> provides that data recorded pursuant to <u>proposed law</u> shall not be considered "personally identifiable information".
