2	To amend and reenact R.S. 56:10(B)(15), 104(A)(3) and (8)(a), 649.3(B), and 650(A) and
3	(B)(1), relative to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund and the Conservation
4	Fund; to provide for certain fees charged to disabled residents; to provide for deposit
5	of revenues to that fund and to the Conservation Fund; and to provide for related
6	matters.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 56:10(B)(15), 104(A)(3) and (8)(a), 649.3(B), and 650(A) and (B)(1)
9	are hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
10	§10. Annual report to governor; estimate of proposed expenditures; particular funds;
11	warrants; vouchers; surplus funds

15	(15) There is hereby created within the Conservation Fund a special account
16	known as the "litter abatement and education account" which shall consist of
17	donations collected from the sale of the environmental education license plate
18	provided for in R.S. 47:463.43; revenue received by the Conservation Fund from the
19	Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of motor vehicles as provided
20	in R.S. 32:412; revenue received by the Conservation Fund from fines for violations
21	of the provisions of Part I of Chapter 21 of Subtitle II of Title 30 as provided in R.S.
22	30:2532; funds from public or private donations and any other source which may
23	specify deposit to this account; and any remaining balance in the Louisiana
24	Environmental Education Fund as of August 15, 2011. The revenues shall be subject

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1	to the same requirements as provided for other revenues placed in the Conservation
2	Fund in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection. The funds in this account shall be used
3	solely for litter abatement and enforcement; public service announcements; develop,
4	review, approve, and implement a plan for statewide environmental education; for
5	the training of operators of vehicles regarding littering; to finance local littering
6	enforcement activities in order to promote public safety, order, and general welfare
7	by making the streets, roads, rivers, streams, bayous, lakes, waterways, and highways
8	of Louisiana clean, safe, and free of debris, litter, and other material falling from or
9	being thrown from vehicles; and to award grants to nonprofit organizations and
10	public agencies for the development, dissemination, and assessment of such
11	education programs.

13	§104. License fees; reciprocity; exceptions
14	A. No license shall be issued under this Part unless there has been previously
15	paid a fee or fees as hereinafter set forth:
16	* * *
17	(3) In the case of a resident, except as specified in Subsection B of this
18	Section, a fee of fourteen dollars is required to hunt, take, possess, or transport deer,
19	turkey, or bobcat. This license, which shall be known as a big game license, shall
20	be required in addition to the basic hunting license. In addition and except as
21	provided for in Paragraph (8) of this Subsection, a fee of ten dollars and fifty cents
22	may be charged a resident for the issuance of a special primitive firearms license to
23	take deer during the special deer season for primitive firearms as provided in R.S.
24	56:103(C)(2).

26	(8)(a) A resident who is totally and permanently disabled and receiving a
27	disability benefit from the federal social security system or a disability retirement
28	income from a retirement system whose members are exempt from federal social
29	security, either pursuant to the Railroad Retirement Insurance Act, 45 U.S.C. 231,
30	or because they are employees of a state or a political subdivision of the state that

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1	has not voluntarily agreed to participate in federal social security under 42 U.S.C.
2	418, may purchase a basic hunting license which will also include a WMA hunting
3	permit for a fee of five dollars in order to hunt, take, possess, or transport wild birds
4	and quadrupeds on which open seasons are declared. In addition to the basic hunting
5	license fee, any such person may also purchase a resident big game hunting license
6	for a fee of five dollars and , a resident bow hunting license for a fee of five dollars,
7	or a special primitive firearms license for a fee of five dollars.

9	§649.3. Combination lifetime hunting and sports fishing license
10	* * *
11	B. A combination lifetime hunting and sports fishing license holder shall be
12	entitled to the individual gear license privileges under the recreational gear license
13	as provided in R.S. 56:302.3. However, an additional fee shall be levied for lifetime
14	privileges for each recreational fishing gear license in an amount that is equal to ten
15	times the cost of an annual license issued under the provisions of R.S. 56:302.3. Of
16	the revenues received from the additional gear license fees, one-tenth shall be
17	deposited to the Conservation Fund to be used by the department for its fiscal
18	operations. The remaining nine-tenths of the revenues collected shall be deposited
19	to the Lifetime License Endowment Fund, R.S. 56:650.

21	§650. Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund
22	A.(1) Subject to the exception contained in Article VII, Section 9(A) of the
23	Constitution of Louisiana, all funds collected by the commission from every source
24	shall be paid into the state treasury and under the provisions of this Part shall be
25	credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Out of the funds remaining in
26	the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is allocated from
27	that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state which
28	become due and payable within any fiscal year, the treasurer shall, prior to placing
29	such remaining funds in the state general fund, pay monthly into a public trust fund
30	created within the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Conservation

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1Fund and designated as the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund, after making2the deductions provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection. deposit as provided in3Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, an amount equal to the revenues collected under the4provisions of this Part. The funds credited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust5Fund shall be expended as provided in this Section.

6 (2)(a) Of the revenues received from the issuance of each lifetime license 7 other than a senior lifetime license, The state treasurer shall deduct fifty percent of 8 the revenues collected by the commission and shall credit such amount one hundred 9 dollars shall be credited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund, and the 10 remaining funds shall be credited to the Conservation Fund to be used for the 11 purpose of administering and enforcing the provisions of this Chapter or for such 12 other purposes as may be determined by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, 13 or by law, in accordance with requirements of the hunting and fishing or other 14 special license fees that would have been required for the hunting and fishing 15 privileges covered by the provisions of R.S. 56:649.1, 649.2, 649.3, or 649.4.

16(b) Of the revenues received from the issuance of each senior lifetime17combination license, five dollars shall be credited to the Conservation Fund, and the18remaining revenues shall be credited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund.

19 (c) Of the revenues received from the additional gear license fees levied in 20 R.S. 56:649.3(B), one-tenth shall be deposited to the Conservation Fund to be used 21 by the department for its fiscal operations. The remaining nine-tenths of the 22 revenues collected shall be deposited to the Lifetime License Endowment Trust 23 Fund. However, for senior lifetime combination licenses, five dollars shall be 24 credited to the Conservation Fund. After deducting the amounts provided in this 25 Paragraph, the balance of the funds collected for each license shall be credited to the 26 Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund as provided in this Section.

B.(1) The Lifetime License Endowment Trust Fund is <u>hereby</u> established as
a public trust fund, the principal of which shall be invested at interest in perpetuity
and shall not be expended. The state treasurer shall, on a monthly basis, credit the
Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries Conservation Fund with all interest

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1	revenues generated by investment of the principal of the Lifetime License
2	Endowment Trust Fund.

4	Section 2. The provisions of this Act shall supersede and control to the extent of any
5	conflict with any provisions of Act which originated as House Bill No. 292 of the 2011
6	Regular Session of the Legislature.
7	Section 3. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2011.
