ENVIRONMENT: Provides for litter abatement and enforcement and education programs

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2506(A)(introductory paragraph) and (B) and 2507(A), R.S. 3 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), and (6), (B)(1), (2), and (7)(e)(i)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee) 4 and (ii)(aa), (cc), (dd)(I), and (ee), R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a), and R.S. 47:463.43(A), (D), 5 and (E), to enact R.S. 56:10(B)(14), and to repeal R.S. 30:2504 and 2511, R.S. 6 36:609(B)(4), Section 3 of Act No. 527 of the 2003 Regular Session of the 7 Legislature, Act No. 363 of the 2004 Regular Session of the Legislature, Act No. 8 190 of the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, and R.S. 32:412(A)(1), (2), (5), 9 (6), (B)(1), (2), (7)(e)(i)(aa), (dd)(I), (e)(ii)(aa), and (dd)(I) as amended by Act No. 10 9 of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, relative to litter 11 abatement, enforcement, and education; to provide for the Louisiana Environmental 12 Education Commission; to provide for the responsibility and duties of the 13 Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to provide litter abatement and enforcement; 14 to provide for education programs; to abolish the environmental education division 15 within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; to provide for special license plates; 16 to provide for the disposition of certain funds collected from driver's license issuance 17 and renewal and special license plates; and to provide for related matters.

27	A.(1) Every applicant for a Class "D" driver's license, or for a renewal of a
28	Class "D" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a
29	population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall

pay for such basic license a fee of twenty-eight dollars and fifty cents. Seven dollars and forty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(2) The fee for Class "D" drivers' licenses, or renewal of a Class "D" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirty-six dollars, ten dollars of which fee shall be payable by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. One dollar and twenty-three cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(5) Every applicant for a Class "E" driver's license, or for a renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, except those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of thirteen dollars and fifty cents, which shall be the cost of such basic license. Three dollars and seventy-five cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(6) The fee for a Class "E" driver's license, or renewal of a Class "E" driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess

of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be thirteen dollars and fifty cents, two dollars and fifty cents of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension funds of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Two dollars and fifty cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

B.(1) Every applicant for a Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, or for a renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, except for those bona fide residents of cities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans, shall pay for such basic license a fee of forty-one dollars. Ten dollars and eighty cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

(2) The fee for a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, or for the renewal of a basic Class "A", "B", or "C" commercial driver's license, issued to bona fide residents of municipalities having a population in excess of four hundred fifty thousand the city of New Orleans shall be fifty-one dollars, ten dollars of which fee shall be paid by the department to the board of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans. Ten dollars of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife litter abatement and

(ee) Five dollars of the fee shall be payable by the department to the board
of trustees of the police pension fund of such municipalities the city of New Orleans.
Sixty-one cents of the fee shall be paid to the State Police Pension and Retirement
Fund. One dollar of the fee shall be forwarded by the department to the
environmental education division within the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries,
office of wildlife litter abatement and education account which is created within the
Conservation Fund through the provisions of R.S. 56:10(B)(14).

Section 3. R.S. 36:605(B)(4)(a) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: §605. Powers and duties of the secretary of wildlife and fisheries

* * *

B. The secretary shall have authority to:

* * *

(4)(a) Enforce the laws of the state and rules and regulations relative to wildlife and fisheries, including but not limited to laws, rules, and regulations relative to illegal hunting, fishing, and trapping, boating safety regulations, and the prohibited methods, times, or seasons, and locations therefor, including the illegal transportation, shipping, and sale of wildlife, fish, and other aquatic life and furbearing animals and alligators, and including the illegal possession of wildlife, game, or fish and other aquatic life, and develop and implement litter abatement, enforcement, and awareness programs and toward these ends shall appoint not less than twenty-five wildlife agents, whose entire time, under the direction of the secretary, shall be devoted to the performance of their official duties as prescribed by law. Notwithstanding R.S. 40:5, the secretary shall have authority to enforce the laws specifically assigned by statute to the Department of Health and Hospitals and any rules or regulations promulgated thereunder for the purpose of regulating the harvesting, processing, or distribution of molluscan shellfish.

4	A. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special
5	prestige motor vehicle license plate for the environmental education division within
6	by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, office of wildlife, R.S. 30:2503 et seq
7	for the purposes provided in R.S. 56:10(B)(14). The license plates shall be restricted
8	to use on passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles.

12	issuance; funds from public or private donations and any other source which may
13	specify deposit to this account; and any remaining balance in the Louisiana

Morris HB No. 292

Abstract: Provides for the Environmental Education Commission and the litter abatement and education account in the Conservation Fund.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the Environmental Education Commission in the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries, provides for the commission's powers and duties, and creates the office of environmental education within the office of wildlife, Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries.

Proposed law retains present law except repeals the office of environmental education.

<u>Present law</u> provides for a \$1 fee on the fee charged for driver's licenses to be deposited into the La. Environmental Education Fund and to be used for public service announcements and for the education and training of drivers of motor vehicles regarding littering or to finance local littering enforcement activities until Aug. 15, 2011.

<u>Present law</u> creates a prestige motor vehicle environmental education license plate for the Dept. of Wildlife and Fisheries. Revenues received from the donations from the plates are deposited into the La. Environmental Education Fund to be used for the purposes of the Environmental Education Commission.

<u>Proposed law</u> repeals La. Environmental Education Fund and replaces the fund with the "litter abatement and education account" within the Conservation Fund.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> except the funds from both sources, along with any public or private donations, shall be deposited into the "litter abatement and education account" within the Conservation Fund, and repeals driver's license fee sunset date.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides that funds in the account shall be used solely for litter abatement and enforcement; public service announcements; develop, review, and approve a plan for statewide environmental education and training of operators of vehicles regarding littering; to finance local littering enforcement activities in order to promote public safety, order, and general welfare by making the streets, roads, rivers, streams, bayous, lakes, waterways, and highways of La. clean, safe, and free of debris, litter, and other material falling from or being thrown from vehicles; and to award grants to nonprofit organizations and public agencies for the development, dissemination, and assessment of such education programs.

Act No. 9 of the 2011 First Extraordinary Session amended various provisions of R.S. 32:412, of which are being repealed by the <u>proposed law</u>.

Effective July 1, 2011.
